SPIRITUAL CORNER

Eucharistic Miracle of FERRARA ITALY, 1171

On March 28, 1171, the prior of the Canons Regular Portuensi, Father Pietro da Verona, was celebrating Easter Mass with three confreres (Bono, Leonardo and Aimone). At the moment of the breaking of the consecrated Host, It sprung forth a gush of Blood that threw large drops on the small ceiling vault above the altar. Histories tell of the "holy terror of the celebrant and of the immense wonder of the people who crowded the tiny church." There were many eyewitnesses who told of seeing the Host take on a bloody color and having seen in it the figure of a baby. Bishop Amato of Ferrara and Archbishop Gherardo of Ravenna were immediately informed of the event. They witnessed with their own eyes the miracle, namely "the Blood which we saw redden the altar ceiling vault." The church immediately became a pilgrim destination, and later was rebuilt and expanded on the orders of Duke Ercole d'Este beginning in 1495.

There are many sources regarding this miracle. Among the most important is the Bull of Pope Eugene IV (March 30, 1442), in which the pontiff mentions the miracle in reference to the testimonies of the faithful and ancient historical sources. The 1197 manuscript of Gerardo Cambrense, conserved in Canterbury's Lambeth Library is the oldest document that mentions the miracle. The miracle received recent attention in the "Gemma Ecclesiastica" (Budding of the Church) by historian Antonio Samaritani. Another document which dates to March 6, 1404, is the Bull of Cardinal Migliorati, in which he grants indulgences to "those who visit the church and adore the Miraculous Blood." Even today, on the 28th day of every month in the basilica, which is currently under the care of Saint Gaspare del Bufalo's Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood, Eucharistic Adoration is celebrated in memory of the miracle. And every year, in preparation for the Feast of Corpus Christi, the solemn Forty Hours devotion is celebrated. The eighth centenary of the Miracle was celebrated in 1971.



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Comfort, comfort my people." The prophet of the first reading is told that the time of misery is coming to an end. Comfort the people. Let them know that God is going to come to free them from their sadness and their pain.

Right now, we need comfort. We are living in exceedingly difficult times.

Many of our families have had a difficult four months with horrible tragedy. Life as they knew it would never return. They need comforting.

The prophet of the first reading promised comfort to the people. He told them that God was aware of their pain and suffering. They had been held captive by the Babylonians for fifty years. They were totally powerless. They had been led to Babylon with hooks through their noses. They had to serve the pagan kings of Babylon. There was no way that they could be freed. They had no army, no means of rebelling. But then, after the prophecy that God is coming to bring comfort to the people, political events resulted in their being freed to return to Judea and Jerusalem. Babylon was conquered by Persia, and the new power released all the captive peoples to return to their homelands. God found a way to bring comfort to his people.

People are looking for comfort. They may not realize it, but they are looking for God. It is up to us to tell them that Divine Help is near. "Prepare the way of the Lord," John the Baptist calls out in the Gospel reading for the Second Sunday of Advent. We are called to tell people that God is in control. He is going to free us from all that is attacking us. We have to tell people to have faith and trust in God. We are called to let others know that comfort is near. More than that, we are called to let them know that Jesus, the Divine Comforter, is here.

We can do this if our faith is the very center of our lives. We can do this if our lives are motivated by the presence of the Lord within us. We can proclaim comfort by living our Christianity. The decisions that we make in life, the way that we treat other people, the very way that we approach our day, must reflect the presence of Christ within us. People need us to be men and women of faith. People need our witness to our Christianity.

Milagro Eucarístico de FERRARA ITALIA, 1171

El 28 de marzo de 1171, el prior de los Canónigos Regulares Portuensi, el Padre Pedro de Verona, estaba celebrando la Misa Pascual, siendo asistido por tres hermanos (Bono, Leonardo y Aimone). En el momento de la fracción, la Hostia consagrada salpicó un flujo de Sangre, llegando a manchar visiblemente la bóveda que estaba sobre el altar. Las historias narran "el sagrado terror del celebrante y la inmensa maravilla del pueblo que desbordaba la iglesita". Muchos testimonios afirmaron haber visto que la Hostia asumía el color de la Sangre y que en ella se dejaba ver claramente la figura de un niño. El Obispo Amato de Ferrara y el Arzobispo Gerardo de Ravenna fueron informados del Prodigio, pudiendo constatar ellos mismos la Sangre impregnada en el techo, es decir, "la Sangre que en forma muy viva teñía de rojo la pequeña bóveda del altar". La iglesia se convirtió muy pronto en meta de peregrinaciones. Fue restaurada en varias ocasiones y ampliada por orden del duque Hércules I d'Este, a partir del año 1495.

Son muchos los testimonios que hablan del Milagro, entre ellos, el más importante es la Bula Pontificia del Papa Eugenio IV (30 de marzo de 1442). En ella, el Pontífice menciona el Prodigio haciendo referencia a los testimonios de los fieles y a las antiguas fuentes históricas. El manuscrito de Gerardo Cambrense, conservado en la Biblioteca Lamberthiana de Canterbury, es el documento más antiguo (1197) que narra el Prodigio. El historiador Antonio Samaritani ha recuperado estas narraciones en su reciente obra Gemma Eccelsiastica. Otro documento de importancia es la Bula del Cardenal Migliorati del 6 de marzo de 1404. En ella se conceden indulgencias a "quien visitará la iglesia y rendirá honores a la Sangre Prodigiosa". Aún hoy, el 28 de cada mes, en la Basílica de San Gaspar del Búfalo, los Misioneros de la Preciosísima Sangre, ofician la Adoración Eucarística en memoria del Milagro. Cada año, en preparación a la fiesta del Corpus Domini, se celebra la solemnidad de las Cuarenta horas. En 1971 ha sido celebrado el octavo centenario del Milagro.

Hermanas y hermanos, Juan, el pariente de Jesús, el hijo de Zacarías e Isabel, el mismo que por su oficio ha sido llamado "el Bautista," es una figura central de nuestro adviento. Es apenas natural: adviento es "espera," tiempo de preparación, y toda la vida y la misión de Juan Bautista fueron eso: preparar al pueblo de Dios para recibir al Mesías. Juan, pues, está con nosotros en este tiempo litúrgico signado por la esperanza. ¿Cómo se prepara uno para recibir a Jesucristo? Las recomendaciones de Juan en el evangelio de hoy conservan pleno valor. Juan predicó con su ejemplo, que consistió en austeridad y oración, y predicó con su palabra que consistió en arrepentimiento y ser justos.

Esas cuatro cosas son las que necesitamos: una vida sobria, sin apego a lujos ni vanidades; una vida orante, que devuelva a Dios el lugar que le corresponde; una vida humilde, que reconozca que hemos fallado muchas veces, y una vida justa, que preste atención especialmente a los derechos de los más pequeños y de los desposeídos.

Un dato que mucha gente no sabe es que la santidad y la virtud de Juan sobrevivieron mucho tiempo en la memoria de sus contemporáneos. No faltaron incluso los que consideraron que Juan era mayor que Jesús, pues al fin y al cabo fue Jesús el bautizado y Juan el que lo bautizó: un signo que podría interpretarse como que el menor estaba recibiendo del mayor. Además, la vida de penitencia de Juan era notabilísima mientras que Jesús era, para estos efectos, un personaje mucho más "normal" y la gente tiende a pensar que ser muy anormal debe parecerse a ser muy santo. Todo esto viene a la frase final del Evangelio de hoy, frase que el evangelista ha conservado porque es uno de los varios testimonios que los cristianos sin duda utilizaron para aclarar el tema de los dos bautismos, o sea, si era más importante (o poderoso) bautizarse con el bautismo de Juan o con el bautismo cristiano.

Juan dice: Yo los he bautizado a ustedes con agua, pero Él los bautizará con el Espíritu Santo." Juan reconoce en Jesucristo a uno "más fuerte" pero que esa fuerza proviene de lo que Cristo trae a nuestra vida. Juan representa arrepentirse del mal que uno ha hecho, y eso es clave, pero no es todo. Más importante incluso es recibir un impulso, una vida nueva, que haga posible obrar de otra manera.

Letter from Bishop Larry on November 20, 2023

Beloved Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

As we approach the season of gratitude, our hearts swell with thanks for the blessings of faith, family, and friendships. Yet, amidst our celebration, we're mindful of the profound needs among our sisters and brothers in Maui. The wildfire that swept through Lahaina claimed more than a hundred lives, leaving devastation in its wake. Miraculously, Lahaina's Maria Lanakila Church was spared, but most of the school was destroyed. The wildfire left 84 Sacred Hearts students and 12 staff members without homes. However, these setbacks did not stop the school from functioning. Maria Lanakila Parish's Sacred Hearts Mission Church in Kapalua immediately offered its parish space for classrooms and a safe space for keiki.

On All Souls Day, I stood amidst the Sacred Hearts School community, witnessing resilience in laughter and dedication to relief, response and recovery efforts. Blessing newly constructed tent classrooms, I saw a community rising from the ashes, embodying hope and determination. In gratitude, I share a heartfelt video capturing this journey: https://hicathcomfdn.org/SHSTuition. It begins with a song, a beautiful prayer saying "Thanks be to God" in multiple languages. The story illustrates a profound faith, resilience, and aloha as Sacred Hearts School emerges as a beacon of hope. While temporarily located at the mission church, Sacred Hearts School is working diligently to find a "temporary-permanent" home for students with more space for classrooms and a playground until the school can rebuild in Lahaina in 3-5 years. Funds have already been raised for these efforts but impacted students need tuition assistance so they can keep coming to Sacred Hearts School. This is not just a story of survival; it's one of thriving and rebuilding Lahaina's future. So, we have established the Sacred Hearts School Tuition Assistance Fund with the Hawaii Catholic Community Foundation with a goal of \$4 million (we have already raised \$1 million) so each child who is in need of tuition assistance can be assured of a Catholic education while their families rebuild their lives. I appeal to your grateful and generous hearts to support the tuition assistance fund, ensuring that education's light continues to shine for those in need. As we enter the season of giving, may the inspiring story of Sacred Hearts School move your grateful hearts. Supporting the Sacred Hearts School Tuition Assistance Fund makes you a beacon of hope and a partner in rebuilding lives and futures.

In closing, I echo sentiments shared during the Maui Eucharist: "In our collective prayers, we ask for strength, resilience, and healing for the fire victims. May our faith guide us as we navigate challenges, knowing with God's grace, all is possible." Mahalo to all who have been so generous with time, talent,

and treasure in helping this community recover. It's inspiring to see the work and hope so many not only talk about, but live.

May your generosity and faith in action amplify the whispering voice of Christ's constant presence of loving care and may God's abundant blessings be upon you and your loved ones. With a grateful heart and a prayer for continued witness to Jesus. Mahalo.
