

23.B) This experience of full forgiveness cannot fail to open our hearts and minds to the need to *forgive others* in turn. Forgiveness does not change the past; it cannot change what happened in the past, yet it can allow us to change the future and to live different lives, free of anger, animosity and vindictiveness. Forgiveness makes possible a brighter future, which enables us to look at the past with different eyes, now more serene, albeit still bearing the trace of past tears.

For the last Extraordinary Jubilee, I commissioned *Missionaries of Mercy*, and these continue to carry out an important mission. During the coming Jubilee, may they exercise their ministry by reviving hope and offering forgiveness whenever a sinner comes to them with an open heart and a penitent spirit. May they remain a source of reconciliation and an encouragement to look to the future with heartfelt hope inspired by the Father's mercy. I encourage bishops to take advantage of their precious ministry, especially by sending them wherever hope is sorely tested: to prisons, hospitals, and places where people's dignity is violated, poverty abounds and social decay is prevalent. In this Jubilee Year, may no one be deprived of the opportunity to receive God's forgiveness and consolation.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Fr. Kuriakose Nadooparambil, MF

"Teach us how to pray," the disciples asked Jesus. This is the longing of our souls. We want to pray. We want to be with God. Prayer is what we are about, not just here in Church but as people committed to Jesus Christ. We need to nurture our dialogue with him, our prayer Life. We come to Mass to pray the Lord's Supper as a community and to reverence the Lord within us in communion.

Sometimes, I come upon people who say that they don't attend Church, but they pray on their own. I think it is great that they are praying, but I also know that they are depriving themselves of the greatest prayer, the prayer of Jesus Christ at the Last Supper, on the Cross and at Easter. It is great that they are praying alone, but by refusing to join the community they are depriving themselves of the Eucharist.

Maybe we all need to reflect a bit about the mystery of the Eucharist. We go to communion so often that it is easy for us to forget what we are doing and whom we are receiving. When we receive communion, Jesus Christ comes inside of us. He is closer to us than our skin. When we receive communion, we worship Him within us with our whole being. All of us love Eucharistic Adoration. All of us love reverencing the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, when the Lord is exposed in monstrance or processed around the congregation. Eucharistic adoration is wonderful. But there is something infinitely better than Eucharistic Adoration. That is receiving communion. No Eucharistic service is better than receiving communion. In a few moments and every time we receive communion we take Jesus within ourselves. He is there at the Last Supper, looking at each person here and saying this is my body, this is my blood, take and eat, take and drink. When we receive communion Jesus is present on the cross saying, "My body is given up for you. My blood is yours. Even if you were the only person to ever live, I would still accept the cross for you. I want to be inside you. I want you to have my body and blood." When we receive communion, Jesus is present within us at the Resurrection. This is the food of the new life of the Kingdom, the food of eternity, the bread of angels.

Jesus once told the story about a jewel merchant who came upon a valuable pearl. When he found it, he sold everything he had so he could possess it. We have the Pearl of Great Price offered to us every day.

The Eucharist, Holy Communion, the Presence of the Living Lord at the Last Supper, on the Cross and at the Resurrection are within us whenever we receive communion. "Teach us to pray, Lord," the apostles asked. He taught them the Lord's Prayer, and He gave us the Eucharist.

23.B) Esa experiencia colma de perdón no puede

sino abrir el corazón y la mente a *perdonar*. Perdonar no cambia el pasado, no puede modificar lo que ya sucedió; y, sin embargo, el perdón puede permitir que cambie el futuro y se viva de una manera diferente, sin rencor, sin ira ni venganza. El futuro iluminado por el perdón hace posible que el pasado se lea con otros ojos, más serenos, aunque estén aún surcados por las lágrimas.

Durante el último Jubileo extraordinario instituí los *Misioneros de la Misericordia*, que siguen realizando una misión importante. Que durante el próximo Jubileo también ejerciten su ministerio, devolviendo la esperanza y perdonando cada vez que un pecador se dirige a ellos con corazón abierto y espíritu arrepentido. Que sigan siendo instrumentos de reconciliación y ayuden a mirar el futuro con la esperanza del corazón que proviene de la misericordia del Padre. Quisiera que los obispos aprovecharan su valioso servicio, enviándolos especialmente allí donde la esperanza se pone a dura prueba, como las cárceles, los hospitales y los lugares donde la dignidad de la persona es pisoteada; en las situaciones más precarias y en los contextos de mayor degradación, para que nadie se vea privado de la posibilidad de recibir el perdón y el consuelo de Dios.

Hermanas y hermanos, el tema común es la oración y cuánto puede lograrse a través de ella. Aunque, si miramos más detenidamente, la enseñanza de hoy alude a esa forma de oración que todos conocemos y seguramente hemos practicado muchísimas veces: la oración de petición. Además, tanto en el texto del Génesis como en la lectura de San Lucas aparece un hecho: lo que se pide resulta difícil o incómodo. Esto es interesante porque de seguro nosotros mismos hemos sentido más de una vez que lo que pedimos escapa la lógica fría de los hechos y por ello es incómodo o difícil pedirlo. Pero bueno, ¡¡precisamente por eso es una oración de súplica, porque no parece que las cosas vayan a darse como por sí solas!

En el Génesis vemos a Abraham intercediendo a favor de los que, siendo inocentes, se hallan en medio de un pueblo corrupto y vil. Por eso ruega, apelando a la justicia de Dios, de un modo humilde pero persistente. De su ejemplo aprendemos esas dos cualidades que son muy propias de la oración cristiana: humildad y perseverancia. También aprendemos que la oración es diálogo, implica un encuentro real con Aquel que nos ama.

Si en la primera lectura Abraham ruega fundándose en la justicia, y desde ahí argumenta que Dios nunca destruirá al inocente con el culpable, en el evangelio encontramos, otra razón para nuestro ruego: le hablamos a Dios porque somos sus hijos. En la oración se devela y a la vez se hace efectivo el misterio de nuestra condición de hijos, que Cristo predicó y que también hizo posible con su sacrificio redentor, que hizo posible el don del Espíritu Santo para nosotros.

El fundamento último de nuestra oración no es entonces que queremos un mundo mejor, porque eso lo puede querer cualquier ser dotado de razón; no es tampoco que merecemos ser exentos de tales o cuales dolores o problemas. Ni es tampoco porque seamos buenos o libres de culpa. Oramos porque somos hijos. Oramos porque el Espíritu del Hijo ora en nosotros. Oramos con perseverancia, sencillez, confianza y sobre todo con inmenso amor, convencidos como estamos de que Dios sabe qué es lo mejor para nosotros y puede y quiere otorgárnoslo.




