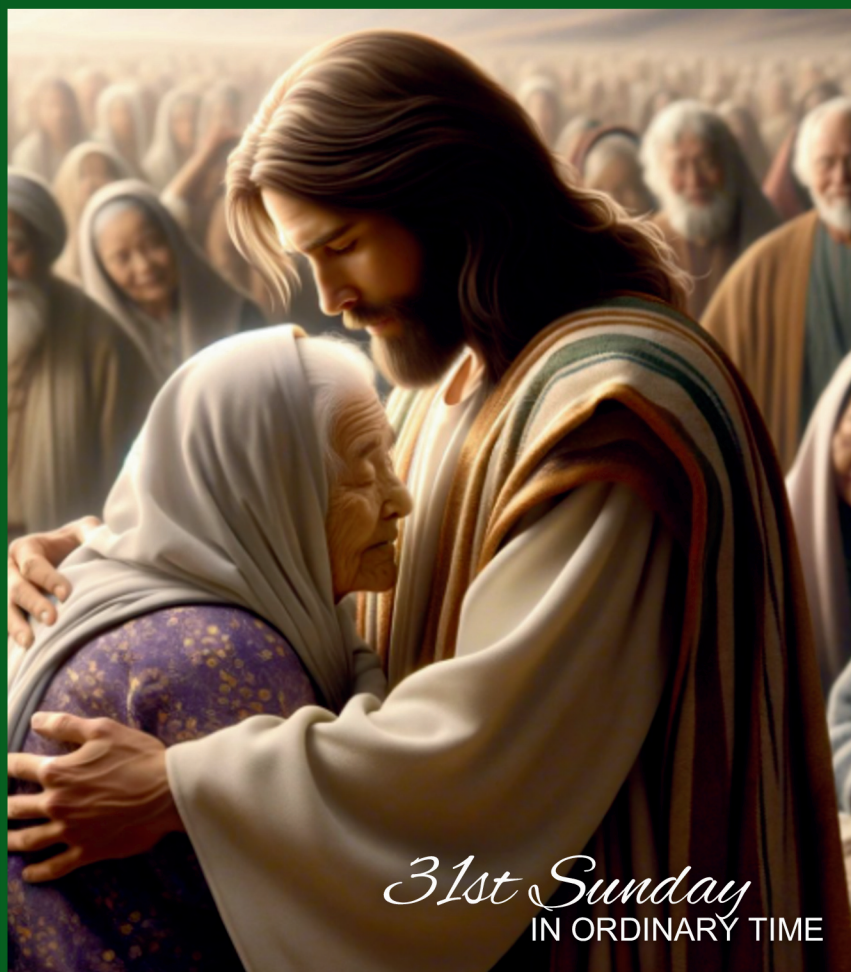

SPIRITUAL CORNER

PAROCHIAL VICAR'S MESSAGE

This is a day specially set apart that we may remember and pray for our dear ones who have gone to their eternal reward, and who are currently in a state or process of ongoing purification. In fact, the Church remembers the faithful departed not just on this day but throughout the entire month of November in a special way. As a part of our annual celebration of the Christian doctrine of the Communion of Saints, yesterday we celebrated All Saints Day, the thanksgiving feast of the Church Triumphant. Today is All Souls Day, our Thanksgiving Feast for the Church Suffering, and tomorrow should be our day of prayer and thanksgiving for All of Us, the Church Militant, thus completing the Communion of Saints.

People of all religions have believed in the immortality of the soul and have prayed for the dead:

1) The Jews, for example, believed that there was a place of temporary bondage from which the souls of the dead would receive their final release. The Jewish catechism Talmud states that prayers for the dead will help to bring greater rewards and blessings to them. Prayer for the souls of the departed is retained by the Orthodox Jews today who recite a prayer known as the Mourner's Kaddish for eleven months after the death of a loved one so that he/she may be purified.

2) First century practice: Jesus and the apostles shared this belief and passed it on to the early Church. "Remember us who have gone before you, in your prayers," is a petition often found inscribed on the walls of the Roman catacombs (Lumen Gentium-50).

3) The liturgies of the Mass in various rites dating from the early centuries of the Church include "Prayers for the Dead."

4) The early Fathers of the Church encouraged this practice. Tertullian (AD 160-240) wrote about the anniversary Masses for the dead, advising widows to pray for their husbands. St. Augustine (AD 354 – 430) remarked that he used to pray for his deceased mother, remembering her request: "When I die, bury me anywhere you like, but remember to pray for me at the altar" (St. Augustine of Hippo, Confessions, Book 9, Chapter 11, Section 27).

5) The Synods of Nicaea, Florence and Trent encouraged the offering of prayers for the dead, citing Scriptural evidence to prove that there is a place or state of purification for those who die with venial sins on their souls.

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

TODAY'S READING

First Reading — The souls of the just are in God's hands (Wisdom 3:1-9).

Psalm — The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want (Psalm 23).

Second Reading — Through Christ's death and resurrection we are reconciled to God and saved by His grace (Romans 5:5-11).

Gospel — Jesus promises eternal life to all who come to him in faith (John 6:37-40).

All Souls Day

Prayers for the faithful departed

All Souls' Day (November 2) is a day when the Church prays for all the faithful departed — the souls in purgatory who are being purified before entering heaven.

It follows **All Saints' Day** (November 1) and reminds us of our connection with all who have died in God's grace. Catholics honor this day by attending Mass, offering prayers, and remembering loved ones who have passed away, asking God to grant them eternal rest and peace.



RENGA ESPIRITUAL

Capellán de la Comunidad Hispana de P. Ornelo Cherrez

Hermanas y hermanos, el misterio central de nuestra fe es la Resurrección de Cristo. Esto hemos de tomarlo en serio: el enemigo más grande de nuestros sueños y esperanzas, es decir, la muerte, ha caído ante uno que es más fuerte: Jesucristo.

La resurrección del Señor es una obra del amor. Levantado del sepulcro, Cristo manifiesta el sentido de toda su vida, que no fue otra cosa sino una continua ofrenda de amor. Es que el freno para amar, lo que nos detiene de amar más y mejor es la muerte. Sentimos que si amamos demasiado perdemos lo nuestro y nos quedamos sin nada. Pero Cristo ha amado hasta quedarse sin nada, porque se ha "vaciado" de sí mismo en la cruz. Cristo ha asumido el riesgo terrible de ofrecerse a las fauces de la muerte, fiado solamente de la voluntad del Padre. La resurrección de Cristo es entonces la respuesta de amor del Padre, que así manifiesta el triunfo de un amor que no se mide, un amor que no se limita porque no se detiene ante la muerte.

Nosotros hemos nacido de ese amor invencible, pues de nosotros fue escrito: "no nacieron de sangre, ni de la voluntad de la carne, ni de la voluntad del hombre, sino de Dios" (Jn 1,13). El que nos une y nos reúne no es otro que el Espíritu Santo, el Espíritu que resucitó a Jesús de entre los muertos. Este es el misterio que llamamos la "comuni3n de los santos": somos uno en Él, gracias al mismo amor que hizo posible el portento de la Encarnaci3n y el milagro sublime de la Resurrecci3n.

No cabe pensar entonces que ese amor, que ya venció una vez y para siempre a la muerte, ahora sea inferior a la muerte. El amor que nos hace "uno" en Jesús es el mismo amor que resucitó a Jesús, y por eso estamos ciertos que la Iglesia que peregrina en esta tierra está indisolublemente unida a la Iglesia que ha pasado ya por el umbral de la muerte.

Nuestras oraciones por los fieles difuntos llevan por consiguiente un doble sello: caridad hacia ellos y certeza de la victoria de Cristo. Les amamos, pero no con un amor nostálgico, prisionero de la fantasía o el recuerdo, sino con el amor eficazísimo propio de la victoria del Señor.

It is a journey of faith through which an awakening of faith and a growth of faith (conversion) takes place. Although we are on the journey together, each one of us has a different, unique, path and length of time it takes. This journey is taken in stages and lasts as long as it needs to last.

The Period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate

This is a time of asking, reflecting, and exploring. "Where is God in my life?" "How has God been working in my life?" "What does God desire for me?" We reflect on who God has sent us to help us on our journey. This period helps us focus on how God is working in us.

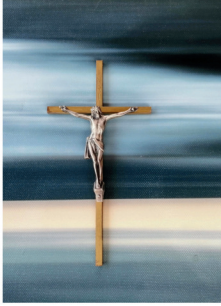
