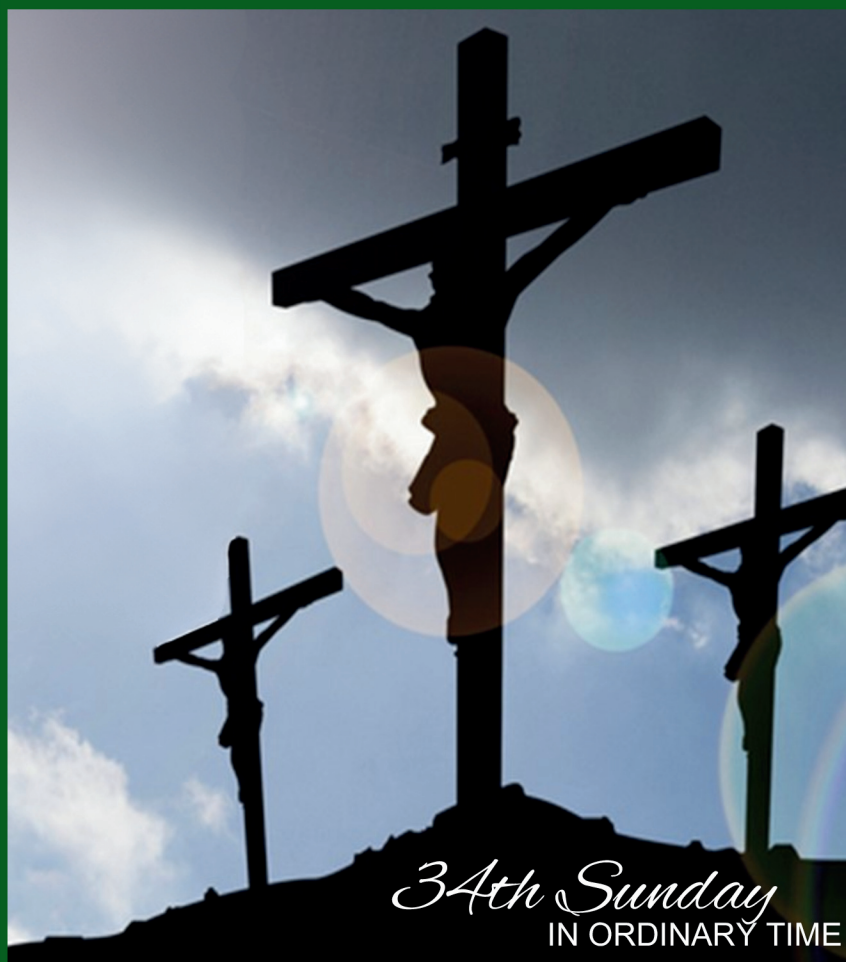

SPIRITUAL CORNER

PAROCHIAL VICAR'S MESSAGE

As we celebrate the Kingship of Christ today, let us remember the truth that he is not our King if we do not listen to him, love him, serve him, and follow him. We belong to his Kingdom only when we try to walk with him, when we try to live our lives fully in the spirit of the Gospel and when that Gospel spirit penetrates every facet of our living. If Christ is King of my life, he must be King of every part of my life, and I must let him reign in all parts of my life. We become Christ the King's subjects when we sincerely respond to his loving invitation: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart" (Mt 11:29). By cultivating in our lives, the gentle and humble mind of Christ, we show others that Jesus Christ is indeed our King and that he is in charge of our lives.

Today's Feast of Christ the King reminds us of the great truth that Christ must be in charge of our lives, that we must give him sovereign power over our bodies, our thoughts, our heart, and our will. In every moral decision we face, there's a choice between Christ the King and Barabbas, and the one who seeks to live in Christ's Kingdom is the one who says, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven." Let us ask ourselves the question, "What does Jesus, my King, want me to do or say in this situation?" Are we praying each day that our King will give us the right words to say to the people we meet that day, words that will make us true ambassadors of Jesus? Does our home life as well as the way we conduct ourselves with our friends come under the Kingship of Jesus? Or do we try to please ourselves rather than him?

Christ has come to serve and to be of service to others. We are called to his service to the Truth. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus saying that the reason for his coming – the reason that he was born – was to "bear witness" to the Truth. The Truth to which Jesus bears witness by His Life and which he teaches us is that God, his Father, is also our loving and forgiving Father, so we are all His children, forming one body. Whatever we do for His children, and our sisters and brothers, we do for Him. So we are called to be a people who reach out to embrace the enemy and the stranger, a people who are called to glory in diversity, a people who will endlessly forgive, a people who will reach out in compassion to the poor and to the marginalized people of our society, a people who will support one another in prayer, a people who will realize that we are called not to be served, but to serve.

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SAINTLY SPOTLIGHT



St. Andrew Dũng-Lạc and Companions (1795–1839)

St. Andrew Dũng-Lạc, a Vietnamese priest, together with his companions, gave their lives for the faith during a time of intense persecution in Vietnam. Despite the danger, they courageously preached the Gospel and cared for the faithful, even in secret. Their unwavering faith and sacrifice stand as a powerful witness to the strength of belief and love for Christ. In 1988, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Andrew Dũng-Lạc along with 116 companions—bishops, priests, and laypeople—who remained steadfast in their devotion. Their example reminds us to hold firm in our faith, even in times of trial. Their feast day is celebrated on November 24.

RENGA ESPIRITUAL

Capellán de la Comunidad Hispana de P. Ornelo Cherrez

Hermanas y hermanos, la primera lectura evoca la figura grande y fascinante del rey David. En efecto, fue durante el reinado de David cuando los hebreos experimentaron de manera más tangible a Dios en medio de su pueblo. El reinado de David vino a ser como una imagen de qué significa reinar sin quitarle el reinado de Dios. David era el rey pero los bienes que recibieron en aquellos años hacían sentir a todos que Dios estaba guiando, defendiendo y fortaleciendo a los suyos.

David es el "rey-pastor." Habiendo sido él mismo pastor de ovejas en su temprana juventud, David conoció que significa guiar al rebaño pero también qué quiere decir poner la vida por el rebaño o buscar los mejores pastos y las aguas más limpias. La enseñanza de esto es que hay dos maneras de gobernar: hay unos que gobiernan para sí mismos, preocupándose de su gloria, su fama, sus riquezas, su bienestar y nada más. Hay en cambio otros, como David, que tienen por norma gobernar cuidando de los que gobiernan. Y tal es el reinado de Cristo: nuestro rey de hecho ha dado su vida por nosotros.

También en la segunda lectura el reinado de Cristo queda caracterizado por su manera de entregarse por nosotros, pues "por su sangre recibimos la redención, el perdón de los pecados." Sin embargo, un tema nuevo aparece: Cristo, "el primero." La idea es que Cristo no empieza a ser rey por su triunfo en la Cruz sino que de hecho por él y para él han sido creadas todas las cosas. Lo que nosotros conocemos más inmediatamente es la obra redentora de Cristo. Al encuentro con él descubrimos que nuestras vidas pueden ser levantadas, limpiadas, embellecidas y sanadas por el amor desbordante de Dios manifestado en Cristo Jesús.

La pregunta de los enemigos a Cristo nos ayuda también a penetrar el sentido de su reinado. No parece muy poderoso este rey que queda en manos de sus adversarios, que bien se ve cuánto lo odian. Y sin embargo, tal es su modo de reinar: poniendo su vida, como el pastor por sus ovejas. En la Cruz, eso de "dar la vida" deja de ser una metáfora bonita y se convierte en una vivificante realidad, el amor de Jesús rompe las cadenas que nos amarra al pecado y a la muerte.

La solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo

Primera lectura — David hace un pacto con los ancianos de Israel en presencia del Señor y lo ungen como rey de Israel (2 Samuel 5:1-3).

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ENFOQUE DE SANTOS



San Andrés Dũng-Lạc y sus compañeros (1795–1839)

San Andrés Dũng-Lạc, sacerdote vietnamita, junto con sus compañeros, entregó su vida por la fe durante una época de intensa persecución en Vietnam. A pesar del peligro, predicaron con valentía el Evangelio y cuidaron de los fieles, incluso en secreto. Su fe inquebrantable y su sacrificio constituyen un poderoso testimonio de la fuerza de la creencia y el amor a Cristo. En 1988, el Papa Juan Pablo II canonizó a San Andrés Dũng-Lạc junto con 116 compañeros — obispos, sacerdotes y laicos — que permanecieron firmes en su devoción. Su ejemplo nos recuerda que debemos mantenernos firmes en nuestra fe, incluso en tiempos de prueba. Su festividad se celebra el 24 de noviembre.
