SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading: You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction. (Mal 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10)

Psalm: In you, Lord, I have found my peace. (Ps 131)

Eucharistic Miracle of BOLSENA ITALY, 1264

The Eucharistic miracle of Bolsena, depicted by Raphael in a well-known fresco in the Vatican Palace, took place in 1263. A German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He was pious, but he found it difficult to accept that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he spoke the words of consecration and immediately Blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands and onto the altar. At first the priest tried to hide the Blood, but eventually he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope Urban IV resided. The Pope sent emissaries to investigate. When the facts were ascertained, he ordered the bishop of the diocese to bring the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of Blood to him. He had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen bearing the spots of Blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto.

Pope Urban IV was prompted by this miracle to commission St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Office for the Mass and Liturgy of the Hours to celebrate the Most Holy Body of the Lord (Corpus Christi). One year after the miracle, in August of 1264, Pope Urban IV introduced the Aquinas's composition, and by means of a papal bull instituted the feast of Corpus Christi.

SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today Jesus is being very critical of the Pharisees and the scribes. First, Jesus tells his listeners that they should observe the teachings of the Pharisees. He has no problem with their teaching because their teachings are correct. However, Jesus does not want his disciples to follow the example of the Pharisees.

The Pharisees were great teachers of the law. There was one problem, however: many of the Pharisees did not practice what they preached. The Pharisees bound up the people with many laws and wanted their disciples and students to practice all of the laws, but they did not always follow the laws themselves.

Many Pharisees also loved sitting in the places of honor as well as being called "Rabbi." Thus, when they went to the synagogue or to a banquet, they automatically took the best seats that were available. The Pharisees also relished the regard and respect that was given to them due to their religious position. Jesus saw all the outward signs of being religious that the Pharisees exhibited, yet Jesus questioned their motivation. Did they simply enjoy the awe, esteem, and perks that were given to them or were they sincerely and deeply spiritual?

Jesus instructs his disciples that their role is to serve the people – not to be served. They are to follow the Jewish laws and customs as the Pharisees taught, but they were not to follow the Pharisees' example. Jesus hoped that his disciples would be humble in the best sense of the word.

We also are the beloved of God, and as the beloved of God, we also need to live by God's law of love. We are to care for our neighbor and all people who are in need (even if we may not like them). Today is a good day for us to aware of our personal motivations! Why do we do what we do? Is it so others will think highly of us? Is it because we simply care about people and desire to help them as best we can?

Service is a great gift to give others. I suspect that most of the time our service consists of small daily tasks or actions. However in this process, perhaps the true gift is noticing another's need and then reaching out to serve in a loving way!

Today may we have open eyes and open hearts. May we reach out to the people around us and care for them. Perhaps today someone will reach out and care for us.

SPIRITUAL CORNER

LECTURAS DE HOY

Prima Lectura: Os habéis separado del camino recto y habéis hecho que muchos tropiecen en la ley. (*Mal 1, 14-2, 8-10*)

Salmo: Señor, consérvame en tu paz. (*Salmo 130*)

Segunda Lectura: Deseábamos entregaros non solo el Evangelio de Dios, sino hasta nuestras propias personas (*1 Tes 2, 7-9, 13*)

Evangelio: Ellos dicen, pero no hacen. (*Mt 23, 1-12*)

Milagro Eucarístico de BOLSENA - ITALIA, 1264

Las modernas investigaciones históricas confirman los más antiguos testimonios acerca del Milagro sucedido en el verano de 1264. Un sacerdote de Boemia, Pedro de Praga, se dirigió a Italia con el fin de obtener una audiencia con el Papa Urbano IV, quien durante el verano se había trasladado a Orvieto, junto con sus cardenales y numerosos teólogos, entre ellos Santo Tomás de Aquino. Pedro de Praga, luego de haber sido recibido por el Papa, emprendió el camino de regreso hacia Boemia, pero en el camino se detuvo en Bolsena, donde celebró la Misa en la iglesia de Santa Cristina. En el momento de la consagración, mientras el sacerdote pronunciaba las palabras que permiten la transubstanciación, sucedió el milagro, descrito así en una placa de mármol: "de pronto, aquella Hostia apareció visiblemente como verdadera carne de la cual se derramaba roja sangre excepto aquella fracción, que la tenía entre sus dedos, lo cual no se crea sucediese sin misterio alguno, puesto que era para que fuese claro a todos que aquella era verdaderamente la Hostia que estaba en las manos del mismo sacerdote celebrante cuando fue elevada sobre el cáliz".

Gracias a este milagro, el Señor fortificó la fe de Pedro de Praga, sacerdote de grandísima piedad y moral, pero que lamentablemente dudaba de la real presencia de Cristo velado en las Especies, es decir, en las apariencias sensibles del pan y del vino. La noticia del Milagro se difundió inmediatamente, y tanto el Papa como Santo Tomás de Aquino pudieron verificar el milagro. Luego de un atento examen, Urbano IV no sólo aprobó su autenticidad, sino también decidió que el Santísimo Cuerpo del Señor fuese adorado a través de una fiesta particular y exclusiva. Es así que decidió extender la fiesta del Corpus Domini, hasta ese momento únicamente fiesta de la diócesis de Liegi, a toda la Iglesia Universal. El Papa encargó a Santo Tomás la creación de la liturgia que acompañaría la Bula *Transiturus de hoc mundo ad Patrem*. En ella, se exponen las razones de la importancia de la Eucaristía, es decir, la presencia real de Cristo en la Hostia.

Hermanas y hermanos, Jesús nos da una clave fundamental: hay que saber distinguir las palabras y las obras. Con referencia al proceder hipócrita de los fariseos dice: "Hagan todo lo que les digan, pero no imiten sus obras, porque dicen una cosa y hacen otra" (Mt 23,3). Es como si nos dijera: "las obras malas no implican palabras falsas". Para la mayoría de nosotros el criterio es que las obras malas desacreditan a las palabras, aunque éstas sean buenas. ¿Por qué sucede así? Si lo pensamos bien, no es extraño. De hecho, nuestras palabras y pensamientos son de modo ordinario superiores a nuestra conducta. Los pensamientos son espejo de nuestros ideales, que por lo general son mayores y mejores que nosotros. Cuando seguimos las palabras de los superiores estamos siguiendo lo mejor que ellos tienen, aunque ellos mismos no lo alcancen.

En este punto cabe relacionar el tema principal de estas lecturas (la primera y el Evangelio) con la segunda, tomada de la Carta de san Pablo a los Tesalonicenses. El apóstol, como haciendo contraste a lo que venimos comentando, describe su misión con término emotivos y hermosos: "los tratamos con la misma ternura con la que una madre estrecha en su regazo a sus pequeños. Tan grande es nuestro afecto por ustedes, que hubiéramos querido entregarles, no solamente el Evangelio de Dios, sino también nuestra propia vida, porque han llegado a sernos sumamente queridos" (1 Tes 2,7-8).

Ese amor, delicado y fuerte a la vez, es propio de lo que san Juan Pablo II ha llamado la "caridad pastoral". Es el estilo propio de un verdadero pastor. El efecto de esta caridad lo cuenta también Pablo: "al recibir ustedes la palabra que les hemos predicado, la aceptaron, no como palabra humana, sino como lo que realmente es: palabra de Dios" (1 Tes 2,13). De aquí una amonestación para el pastor: ¿cuál es la calidad de tu amor? Pero también una invitación para el pueblo fiel: ¿buscas en la palabra de tu pastor, ante todo y sobre todo la palabra de Dios? Cristo, con gesto profético, invita a abolir el amor a los privilegios. Pablo nos invita a purificar y levantar el amor a las personas. Estas dos invitaciones se encuentran y abrazan en tierras de la humildad. Esta es la virtud que hermana. Más allá de nuestros títulos, posición social o nivel económico, ¿qué somos? Hombres y mujeres necesitados todos de redención, de comprensión, de caridad.
