



SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading: Wisdom is found by those who seek her. (Wis 6:12-16)

Psalm: My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God. (Ps 63)

Second Reading: God, through Jesus, will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. (1 Thes 4:13-18)

Gospel: Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him! (Mt 25:1-13)

Eucharistic Miracle of CANOSIO - ITALY, 1630

Canosio is a small village in the region of Val Maira, in the Diocese of Saluzzo. In 1630, its townspeople had grown cold in their religious observance due to the spread of the Calvinistic heresy. A day after the feast of Corpus Christi, the river at Maira flooded because of a torrential rainfall. The flood waters were so violent and powerful that some massive stones were dislodged from the mountain and threatened to destroy the valley and the village itself!

Father Antonio Reinardi, the pastor of the town, assembled the townspeople with the ringing of the church bells and exhorted them to pray that the Lord would stop the flood. He vowed that if the village of Canosio were spared from the flood's destruction, the townspeople would celebrate in perpetuity an annual feast of Corpus Christi. Father Reinardi then took the Blessed Sacrament and placed it in the monstrance. He then processed towards the raging flood with some of the faithful as they all recited the "Miserere" Psalm 51. After he blessed the raging waters, the rain stopped at once and the flood waters peaked and returned to their normal level. This incident revived the faith of the townspeople of Canosio and to this day they observe the vow that was made.

Unfortunately, many of the documents which attest to the miracle and which were preserved in the parish archives from the 17th Century were burned during the war between France and Spain; what is extant, however, is a copy describing the events and which was left by the pastor who was a witness to what occurred.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Throughout the Gospels, particularly in Matthew where today's gospel is taken, Jesus emphasizes the need for inner transformation. His complaint against the Pharisees was that they were hypocrites. They behaved one way but were another way. He called them whiten sepulchers.

On the outside, they looked nice and clean. On the inside they were rotten. The tax collectors and prostitutes who turned to Jesus transformed their lives. Their devotion to the Lord was a reflection of the Christian disposition they had taken on. So, how do we form and nourish the Christian attitude of life? On the negative, we cannot give ourselves over to that which destroys the presence of the Lord. We live in a materialistic society. To the vast majority of society success is counted in the amount of possessions a person accumulates. Pleasure, even fleeting pleasure, is the goal of life. We, you, and I, have to fight against the forces outside of us and, particularly, within us that are drawing us into materialism and away from the Christian disposition of life.

On the positive, we can form and nourish the Christian disposition by continually communicating with the Lord. We need to pray daily. We need to find a time, even if it is brief, but still a time when we can be with the Lord and free of the distractions of life. If we have a family, then we have the additional responsibility to pray as a family every day. Bedtime prayers when the children are little is a great time for this. As they get older, Mom and Dad should continue praying with their children every evening and then, as time goes on, for their children every evening.

The main focus of our prayer life should be on the Lord's Day, Sunday. On Sunday we celebrate the passion, death, and resurrection of the Lord and, if we are able to come to Mass, receive the Eucharist. The presence of Christ within us in this sacrament gives us the strength to be who we claim to be, Christians. Today's first reading speaks about wisdom. Wisdom is a way of life. The wise are always ready for the Lord because they are always united to him. The gospel lesson is simple for this Sunday. Be like the wise virgins. Be ready to celebrate the banquet of the Lord's love "For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first." (1 Thes 4:17)

LECTURAS DE HOY

Prima Lectura: Quienes buscan la sabiduría la encuentran. (*Sab 6, 12-16*)

Salmo: Señor, mi alma tiene sed de ti. (*Salmo 62*)

Segunda Lectura: Dios llevará con él, por medio de Jesús, a los que han muerto (*1 Tes 4, 13-18*)

Evangelio: ¡Que llega el esposo, salda su encuentro! (*Mt 25, 1-13*)

Milagro Eucarístico de CANOSIO - ITALIA, 1630

Canosio es un pequeño pueblo del valle de Maira, en la diócesis de Saluzzo. En 1630, la población había perdido el fervor de la práctica religiosa a causa de la difusión de la herejía calvinista. Algunos días después de la fiesta del Corpus Domini, el río Maira se desbordó por la abundancia de las lluvias. La furia de las aguas fue tan violenta que arrastró consigo enormes rocas, desprendidas de las montañas, que se dirigían hacia el valle y el pueblo.

Don Antonio Reinardi, párroco del pueblo, convocó con las campanas a todos los ciudadanos para invitarles a pedir al Señor para que cese el desborde. Propuso, además, hacer un voto: si el pueblo de Canosio se salvaba de las furias devastadoras del torrente, los habitantes celebrarían perpetuamente, cada año, una fiesta en la octava del Corpus Domini. Don Rainardi tomó consigo el Santísimo Sacramento, lo colocó en la custodia y se dirigió en procesión hacia el torrente, acompañado por algunos fieles mientras cantaban el "Miserere". Mientras impartía la bendición, las lluvias cesaron inmediatamente y el nivel del torrente volvió a la normalidad. Este episodio contribuyó a reavivar la fe de la población de Canosio, que hasta hoy siguen cumpliendo el voto prometido. Lamentablemente, muchos de los documentos que describían el Milagro, conservados hasta el siglo XVII en los archivos parroquiales, fueron quemados durante la guerra entre España y Francia. Sin embargo, existe la copia del informe realizado por el párroco, que fue testigo en primera persona de los hechos.

Hermanas y hermanos, la invitación de Jesús es clara: preparen su despertar. Algunas simplemente no prepararon su despertar. El cansancio, el hastío o la oscuridad de la noche les ganaron y ellas pasivamente entregaron al sueño sin pensar qué podría suceder después. Otras en cambio, aunque sintieran que la noche les podía vencer, hicieron acopio de aceite, de modo que al despertar pudieran contar con algo para vencer a la noche. Es un asunto de conciencia: unas fueron conscientes de que podían dormirse, y tomaron medidas al respecto; otras sencillamente se dejaron ganar del sueño.

Para nosotros, ¿qué es preparar el despertar? Depende de qué sueño estemos hablando. Uno puede pensar en el sueño de la muerte, cosa que suena muy concorde con el tono escatológico de estos capítulos finales del evangelio de Mateo. Quienes se dejan llevar por este sueño son quienes extinguen su mirada sobre este mundo como si nada realmente fuera a suceder después. Quienes, por el contrario, son previsivos, guardan aceite, que es una manera de guardar luz. Aunque su cuerpo sea vencido por el sueño, hay un poco de luz que no duerme con ellos. ¿Qué luz estamos guardando? ¿Qué puede alumbrar en nosotros cuando ya nos hayamos dormido, esto es, cuando ya la muerte nos haya sometido a su poder?

La primera lectura nos habla también de la luz: "radiante e incorruptible es la sabiduría" (*Sab 6,12*). La sabiduría es incorruptible; es un género de luz que corresponde bien al aceite de que nos habló el evangelio, porque aunque el sueño de la muerte nos atrape, la sabiduría no está sujeta al imperio de la muerte y puede estar con nosotros cuando se escuche la voz: "...¡llega el esposo!" (*Mt 25,6*). Vale la pena recordar que esta sabiduría es mucho más que conocimiento. No se trata de erudición o de capacidad intelectual, aunque tampoco riñe con ellas. Esta sabiduría sale al encuentro de quienes la buscan " y colabora con ellos en todos sus proyectos" (*Sab 6,16*). Consiste más, entonces, en una ciencia para la vida, un saber vivir. Por consiguiente el mensaje sería: saber vivir el camino de esta vida prepara la vida que vendrá después de este camino. Esperar al Esposo es esperar un gozo que no tiene semejante en esta tierra. Las bodas son el día de la alegría, según expresión del Cantar de los Cantares (3,11). Nosotros, pues, no esperemos en el vacío o en la incertidumbre.






