SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading - The Lord will prepare a feast and wipe away the tears from every face (*Is 25:6-10a*)

Psalm - I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. (*Ps 23*)

Gospel - Invite to the wedding feast whomever you find. (*Mt 22:1-14*)

Eucharistic Miracle of SAINT CLARE OF ASSISI ITALY, 1240

This Eucharistic miracle is cited in The History of Saint Clare, Virgin written by Tommaso da Celano, and describes how Saint Clare of Assisi succeeded, with the Blessed Sacrament, in turning away Saracen troops in the pay of Emperor Frederick II of Sweden. The history goes like this: "By imperial order, regiments of Saracen soldiers and bowmen were stationed there (the convent of San Damiano in Assisi, Italy), massed like bees, ready to devastate the encampments and seize the cities. Once, during an enemy attack against Assisi, city beloved of the Lord, and while the army was approaching the gates, the fierce Saracens invaded San Damiano, entered the confines of the monastery and even the very cloister of the virgins. The women swooned in terror, their voices trembling with fear as they cried to their Mother, Saint Clare.

"Saint Clare, with a fearless heart, commanded them to lead her, sick as she was, to the enemy, preceded by a silver and ivory case in which the Body of the Saint of saints was kept with great devotion. And prostrating herself before the Lord, she spoke tearfully to her Christ: 'Behold, my Lord, is it possible You want to deliver into the hands of pagans Your defenseless handmaids, whom I have taught out of love for You? I pray You, Lord, protect these Your handmaids whom I cannot now save by myself.' Suddenly a voice like that of a child resounded in her ears from the tabernacle: 'I will always protect you!' 'My Lord,' she added, 'if it is Your wish, protect also this city which is sustained by Your love.' Christ replied, 'It will have to undergo trials, but it will be defended by My protection.' Then the virgin, raising a face bathed in tears, comforted the sisters: 'I assure you, daughters, that you will suffer no evil; only have faith in Christ.' Upon seeing the courage of the sisters, the Saracens took flight and fled back over the walls they had scaled, unnerved by the strength of she who prayed. And Clare immediately admonished those who heard the voice I spoke of above, telling them severely: 'Take care not to tell anyone about that voice while I am still alive, dearest daughters.'"


PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Gospel talks about the wedding banquet that a king prepares for his son, only to have the invited refuse to come and even mistreat his servants. The King then invites strangers to the meal, who have a whopping fun time. Then, in what really is a second part of the parable added on, the king spots a man without the proper wedding garment. He gets really upset and throws the man out where there will be a weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Perhaps you might wonder, as I know I have, "Why is the Host so upset over this man's clothes?" After all, this is a traveler or a vagrant, how can he be expected to have a fine wedding garment? That would be missing the point for the sake of the detail, something we always have to be careful of regarding scripture. This parable is not about wearing clothes. It is about wearing Jesus Christ. "Put on the Lord Jesus Christ," St. Paul tells the Romans, and the Galatians, and the Colossians, and the Ephesians and us. The man who came without the proper clothes is the Christian in name only, who refuses to put on Jesus Christ throughout his life. This is the person who accepts the invitation of the Lord but refuses to exercise his or her responsibility in the Christian community. We are invited to share the intimacy of the Banquet of Heaven. We are invited into God's presence. God does not ask a lot from us to be with him. But he does expect us to wear our Christianity. The way we respond to his love must be evident to the world. People should know that we are Christians by the way we live our lives.

Our wedding garment is therefore being woven daily, by the quality of our interaction with others. In this sense, we hold tomorrow in our own hands, as with the help of God's grace we build our own eternal future.

Milagro Eucarístico de SANTA CLARA DE ASÍS ITALIA, 1240

Hermanas y hermanos, comer es mucho más que saciar una necesidad. Es un acto social, un tiempo de descanso, la ocasión de disfrutar algo placentero, entre otras cosas. Si ahondamos en este símbolo descubrimos que el banquete es la transición entre el deber y la fiesta, entre la tarea y el descanso, entre lo que hay que hacer y lo que a uno le gusta hacer, entre el trabajo y la celebración. Una expresión nos llama la atención en la primera lectura: el día del banquete es el día de las revelaciones; es el día en que se arranca "el velo que cubre el rostro de todos los pueblos, el paño que oscurece a todas las naciones." Nosotros no asociaríamos espontáneamente comer y recibir una luz o revelación especial. La cosa suena más razonable en el contexto de los banquetes de los reyes. Mucha gente nunca podía ver al rey, o sólo lo veía de muy lejos. Un banquete era la ocasión única de ver el rostro del rey, que quedaba grabado en la memoria como un tesoro, pues la época no tenía ni muchos retratos fiables ni cámaras de fotografía.

Dios se revela en su banquete. Es el rey que hemos estado esperando, el que siempre hemos querido contemplar. Verlo a él, saciarnos en su belleza, saber que es verdad todo lo que nos prometió: todo ello es más valioso y delicioso que los mismos alimentos y bebidas. Y sin embargo, el banquete es todo eso a la vez.

En el Evangelio podemos mencionar que, las excusas de los invitados indican que ellos estaban muy satisfechos con lo que tenían, y ese es el problema: la gente satisfecha ya no tiene apetito para comer. La conclusión es que el llamado al Reino, o sea, el llamado al Banquete, requiere que la gente tenga hambre, que sienta necesidad, que esté insatisfecha. Luego está el detalle, probablemente agregado posteriormente, del que entró sin traje de fiesta. También esto suena absurdo, pero debe recordarse que la indumentaria era parte sobreentendida de la invitación, o como algunos comentaristas indican, era provista muchas veces por el mismo anfitrión. Aún otra interpretación es que el "vestido de bodas" era sencillamente "el mejor vestido," o sea, no la ropa de labor o ropa ordinaria. Cada una de estas interpretaciones conduce a enseñanzas alegóricas útiles, por ejemplo, que si Dios nos invita a él iremos no de cualquier manera, sino con lo mejor de nuestro corazón o lo más puro y brillante de nuestra fe.

Feliz y bendecida semana.

Cuenta así la leyenda: "se habían asentado allí, por orden imperial, filas de soldados y gran cantidad de arqueros sarracenos, apiñados como abejas, para devastar los campamentos y para adueñarse de la ciudad. Ocurrió que durante un asalto enemigo contra Asís, ciudad estimada por el Señor, mientras ya el ejército se acercaba a sus puertas, los feroces Sarracenos irrumpieron en las cercanías de San Damián, dentro de los límites del monasterio, hasta llegar al claustro mismo de las vírgenes. Los corazones de estas mujeres estaban sobrecogidos por el terror, las voces se volvían temblorosas por el miedo y llevaban sus llantos a la Madre (Santa Clara)". Este Milagro Eucarístico es citado en la Leyenda de Santa Clara Virgen, escrita por Tomás de Celano. Describe el Milagro obrado por Santa Clara de Asís que con el Santísimo Sacramento logró hacer retroceder las tropas sarracenas, pagadas por el emperador Federico II de Suabia. "Ella, con corazón impávido, comanda que la conduzcan, enferma como está a la puerta y que la pongan al frente de los enemigos. Precedida por la cajita de plata cubierta de marfil en la que era custodiado con suma devoción el Cuerpo del Santo de santos, postrada en oración ante el Señor, en lágrimas habló a su Cristo: "he aquí, mi Señor, que tú acaso quieres entregar en las manos de los paganos a tus siervas indefensas que yo he hecho crecer por tu amor? Protege, te ruego, Señor, estas siervas que yo ahora, sola, no puedo salvar". Inmediatamente una voz como de niño resonó a sus oídos desde el tabernáculo: "¡yo te custodiaré siempre!" "Mi Señor, añadió, protege también, si así gustas, esta ciudad que por tu amor nos sostiene". Y Cristo a ella: "tendrá que soportar dificultades pero será defendida por mi protección". Entonces la virgen, alzando el rostro bañado en lágrimas conforta a las hermanas en llantos: "¡les doy garantía, hijas, que no sufrirán algún mal; tengan sólo fe en Cristo!". Todos se paralizaron. La audacia de estos fue cambiada por el temor; y abandonando con rapidez los muros que habían escalado, fueron dispersados por la fuerza de aquella que rezaba. Inmediatamente, Clara advirtió con severidad a aquellas que habían escuchado la voz de la que anteriormente se ha hablado, diciéndoles: "estéense bien atentas, hijas queridísimas, de manifestar aquella voz a alguien mientras yo viva".






