SPIRITUAL CORNER

READINGS FOR TODAY

First Reading - By turning from wickedness, a wicked person shall preserve his life. (*Ez 18:25-28*)

Psalm - Remember your mercies, O Lord. (*Ps 25*)

Second Reading - Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus (*Phil 2:1-11*)

Gospel - The tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. (*Mt 21:28-32*)

Eucharistic Miracle of SAINT-ANDRÉ DE LA RÉUNION ISLAND OF LA RÉUNION, 1902

Let's look at Abbot Lacome's report: "It was January 26, 1902. We were celebrating perpetual adoration (the Forty hours devotion). The Most Holy Sacrament was exposed in the tabernacle. I began to celebrate the Mass. After the elevation, at the moment of the Our Father, my eyes were lifted toward the Host and I saw a bright halo around the rays of the monstrance. I continued to recite the prayers of the Mass with great agitation in my soul but which I tried to overcome. We came to the moment for Communion and again I looked toward the monstrance. This time I saw a human face, with lowered eyes and a crown of thorns on the forehead. What moved me the most was the dolorous expression painted on the face. The eyelashes were long and thick. I tried not to let on to the presence of the turmoil agitating inside of me. After Mass, I went to the sacristy and summoned the older children from the choir to go to the altar and closely observe the monstrance.

"The children raced back and told me: 'Father, we see the head of a man in the Host. It is the good Lord revealing Himself!' I understood then that the vision was authentic. A young man of 16, Adam de Villiers, who had studied in a college in France, also arrived. I said to him as well: 'Go in the church and see if you notice something strange in the tabernacle'. The young student went to the sacristy and returned immediately, saying: 'Father, it is the good Lord who appears in the Host. I see His divine face'. Since then, all my doubts disappeared. Slowly the entire town went to the church to see the miracle. Journalists and people from the capital of Saint Denis also arrived. The face on the Host suddenly became animated and the crown of thorns disappeared. I used every possible precaution, and fearing the effects from the rays of light, I had all the candles extinguished and the shutters closed. The phenomenon became even more clear. There was a young artist among the visitors who faithfully reproduced the face in the Host. Later, the vision changed again and a crucifix appeared which covered the entire Host from top to bottom. After the Eucharistic blessing and recital of the Tantum Ergo, the vision disappeared."

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This Sunday's Gospel tells us that we are called to work in the Father's vineyard. The vineyard is your house and my house. The vineyard is your life and my life. The vineyard is that place where others are reaching out to us, seeking the love of Christ in us. They long for Jesus. And they can find Him. They can find Him within us. Within us as a Church and within us as individuals. The famous English author G. K. Chesterton wrote that atheists were balanced on the very edge of belief, but it is belief in almost anything. Some people reject Jesus and then substitute His presence with superstition. They say that they do not believe in God and certainly not in the concept that He could love us so much as to send us His Son,

What is the reality of Jesus in your lives, in my life? How real is He to you? Can we all realize that through the Grace of God, Jesus' presence is stronger, and His Life is more meaningful now than ever before? This is not a matter of feeling; it is a matter of recognizing reality. Everything is for Jesus. Everything that matters in the world flows from Him and leads to Him.

St. Paul put it so beautifully in those closing words of today's second reading; God has bestowed on Him the name that is above every other name; so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, both in heaven, on earth, and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the Glory of God the Father. He is ours. And we are His. We pray today for the courage to serve the Father as He served Him, emptying ourselves of our selfishness, humbling ourselves before our God, loving Him until the day that we are totally united to our Tremendous Lover.

Prima Lectura – Apártate del pecado para que vivas.
(Ez 18, 25-28)

Milagro Eucarístico de Saint-André de la Réunion ISLA DE LA RÉUNION, 1902

Veamos, pues, la narración del mismo Abad Lacome: "Era un 26 de enero de 1902. Celebrábamos la fiesta de la adoración perpetua (las Cuarenta horas), y el Santísimo Sacramento había sido expuesto en el tabernáculo. Comencé la Misa. Luego de la elevación, en el momento del Padre Nuestro, mis ojos se elevaron hacia la Hostia y vi una aureola luminosa que circundaba los rayos de la Custodia. Continué recitando las oraciones de la Misa llegando a dominarme porque sentía una fuerte turbación en el alma. En el momento de la Comunión, miré de nuevo la Custodia. Esta vez vi en la Hostia un rostro humano, con los ojos hacia abajo y una corona de espinas en la frente. Aquello que más me conmovió fue la expresión dolorosa reflejada en el rostro. Las pestañas de los ojos eran largas y delgadas. Traté de disimular ante los presentes la inquietud que se agitaba dentro de mí. Concluida la celebración me dirigí a la sacristía y mandé llamar a los chicos más grandes del coro. Pedí que fueran al altar y observaran atentamente la Custodia.

Ellos regresaron corriendo y me dijeron: "Padre mío, vemos la cabeza de un hombre en la Hostia". ¡Es nuestro buen Dios que se muestra! Entendí, entonces, que la visión era auténtica. Llegó un chico de dieciséis años, Adam de Villiers, que había estudiado en un colegio en Francia. Le dije también a él: "entra también tú en la iglesia y mira y observa algo extraordinario en el tabernáculo". El joven estudiante se dirigió al santuario y regresó inmediatamente. Me dijo: "Padre, es el buen Dios que se ha aparecido en la Hostia, veo su rostro divino. Desde ese momento han desaparecido todas mis dudas". Poco a poco, todo el pueblo se volcó a la iglesia para ver el Milagro. Llegaron también periodistas y gente de la capital, Saint Denis. El rostro de la Hostia se animó de improviso y la corona desapareció. Usé todas las precauciones posibles porque temía el efecto de algún reflejo de luz. Por eso apagué todos los cirios e hice cerrar las ventanas. Entonces, el fenómeno apareció aún más nítido. Es más, en la oscuridad, los rasgos del rostro emanaban verdaderos destellos. Entre los presentes estaba una joven pintora quien reprodujo fielmente el rostro de la Hostia. Más tarde, la visión siguió cambiando, apareciendo en la Hostia un crucifijo que cubría todo el diámetro de la Hostia. Despues de la bendición eucarística y la oración del Tantum Ergo las visiones desaparecieron".

Hermanas y hermanos, la palabra que no cabe, que nunca cabe en nuestra fe cristiana es "fatalismo." Eso de que hay un destino marcado puede servir para algunas obras literarias o para otras religiones. Nosotros, por el contrario, creemos que el futuro es un libro que no está escrito; un libro en el que tenemos el derecho de escribir nuestras propias páginas. Las lecturas de hoy van en esa línea. Nos invitan, casi digo, nos obligan a reconocer que sí es posible cambiar el rumbo. El ser humano no está hecho sino que se va haciendo a sí mismo. Cada decisión que tomas te convierte de algún modo en un ser distinto. Al escoger una u otra opción frente a ti estás escogiendo también un modo u otro de ser.

Hay un camino: recapacitar, por supuesto, el mensaje de la Escritura no es sólo que podemos cambiar sino que podemos mejorar. Nuestra religión es esencialmente un mensaje positivo: la conversión es posible; hoy puedes recapacitar; el resto de tu vida no existe todavía: tú lo llamarás a la existencia. Cambia tu mente, cambia tu corazón y cambiarán también tu vida y tus resultados.

En la primera lectura este mensaje aparece como una invitación vigorosa y abierta a todos: "Si el malvado recapacita y se aparta de los delitos cometidos, ciertamente vivirá y no morirá." El malvado es aquel que ha hecho muchos males, aún más: es aquel a quien consideramos malo en sí mismo. Pero esa naturaleza perversa no tiene la última palabra. El mensaje es simple y poderoso: No estás atado a tu pasado malo. Ni siquiera las palabras que tal vez tú mismo hayas dicho tienen por qué atarte. El segundo hijo de la parábola de Cristo el día de hoy fue uno que había dicho en voz alta: "¡No quiero!" Pero una palabra sabia, puede deshacer lo que hizo una palabra necia.

Por supuesto, se requiere más que buenos propósitos. Esto lo sabemos todos los que hemos experimentado cuán débiles somos y con cuánta facilidad quebrantamos nuestras buenas resoluciones. Cristo nos anuncia y nos concede esa fuerza para no sólo reconocer lo que estuvo mal sino para no sentir ya el mismo deseo de repetirlo. La acción de Cristo en nosotros nos cambia el corazón, enseña el Evangelio. Pablo, hoy nos exhorta con estas palabras: "Tengan los mismos sentimientos que tuvo Cristo Jesús. Hay que ser uno con él para actuar y vivir como él.






