- Break down scar tissue and calcifications

### Conditions Shockwave Therapy Can Help

Shockwave Therapy is especially effective for chronic musculoskeletal conditions—the types of injuries that don't respond well to traditional methods. At Weaver Physio, we commonly use it to treat:

-  Plantar fasciitis (heel pain)
-  Achilles tendinopathy
-  Tennis elbow (lateral epicondylitis)
-  Golfer's elbow (medial epicondylitis)
-  Patellar tendon pain (jumper's knee)
-  Calcific tendonitis in the shoulder
-  Shin splints
-  Hip and gluteal tendinopathy

It is also useful in stubborn cases of back, shoulder, and knee pain where other treatments have not been successful.

Each treatment typically lasts 10–15 minutes, and you may need 3–6 sessions depending on your condition.

### 4. Aftercare

Many patients feel an immediate reduction in pain. Mild soreness may occur for 24–48 hours, but this is part of the body's healing process. Your physiotherapist may also prescribe exercises to maximise results.
