## ST. PAUL CENTER FOR BIBLICAL THEOLOGY

Word of the 'Living Father'

La Eucaristía se nos presenta como un desafío y una promesa. Así es como Jesús la expone en el Evangelio de hoy.

Él no se lo pone fácil a quienes lo escuchan. Estos se sienten repelidos y ofendidos por sus palabras. Incluso cuando comienzan a discutir entre sí, Él insiste en describir el acto de comer y beber su carne y su sangre en términos estrictamente literales. Cuatro veces en la lectura de hoy, Jesús emplea una palabra griega —\*trogein\*— que alude a una forma de comer tosca, casi un roer o masticar con fuerza (véase Juan 6:54, 56, 57, 58).

Él está poniendo a prueba su fe en su Palabra, tal como describe la Primera Lectura de hoy que Dios puso a prueba a Israel en el desierto. El maná celestial no fue dado para saciar el hambre de los israelitas, según explica Moisés; fue dado para mostrarles que el hombre no vive solo de pan, sino de toda palabra que sale de la boca de Dios. También en el Salmo de hoy observamos una conexión entre la Palabra de Dios y el pan de vida. Cantamos que Dios nos sacia con «el trigo más selecto» y que proclama su Palabra al mundo. En Jesús, «el Padre viviente» nos ha entregado su Palabra descendida del cielo, hecha carne para la vida del mundo.

Sin embargo, al igual que los israelitas murmuraron en el desierto, muchos de los presentes en el Evangelio de hoy son incapaces de aceptar esa Palabra. Incluso muchos de los propios seguidores de Jesús lo abandonan tras este discurso (véase Juan 6:66). Pero sus palabras son espíritu y vida; son palabras de vida eterna (véase Juan 6:63, 67).

En la Eucaristía nos convertimos en una sola carne con Cristo. Su vida habita en nosotros, y nuestra vida existe gracias a Él. Esto es lo que Pablo quiere decir en la Epístola de hoy cuando califica a la Eucaristía como una «participación» en el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo. En este sacramento nos hacemos partícipes de la naturaleza divina (véase 1 Pedro 2:4). Este es el misterio de la fe que Jesús nos pide creer. Y nos ofrece su promesa: que, al participar de su carne y su sangre —las mismas que resucitaron de entre los muertos—, nosotros también resucitaremos en el último día.



# CORPUS CHRISTI

## THE SOLEMNITY OF BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

### Second Sunday after Pentecost

On the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we give special honor to Jesus, truly present in the most Blessed Sacrament of the altar. As Catholics, we worship the presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, both during Mass and outside of Mass. We are encouraged to spend time in prayer before the Lord in the Eucharist. Many parishes offer regular exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance. We may also choose to visit the church at other times to adore the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle.

### Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole plan for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins with our Baptism, when by the power of the Holy Spirit we are joined to Christ, thus becoming adopted sons and daughters of the Father. It is strengthened and increased in Confirmation. It is nourished and deepened through our participation in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. . . . In being united to the humanity of Christ we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. . . .

By being united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we are drawn up into the eternal rela-

tionship of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As Jesus is the eternal Son of God by nature, so we become sons and daughters of God by adoption through the sacrament of Baptism. Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation (Chrismation), we are temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, and by his indwelling we are made holy by the gift of sanctifying grace. The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we will share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The Fathers of the Church called this participation in the divine life "divinization" (theosis). In this we see that God does not merely send us good things from on high; instead, we are brought up into the inner life of God, the communion among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving") we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.

### When the bread and wine become the Body of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?

In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under

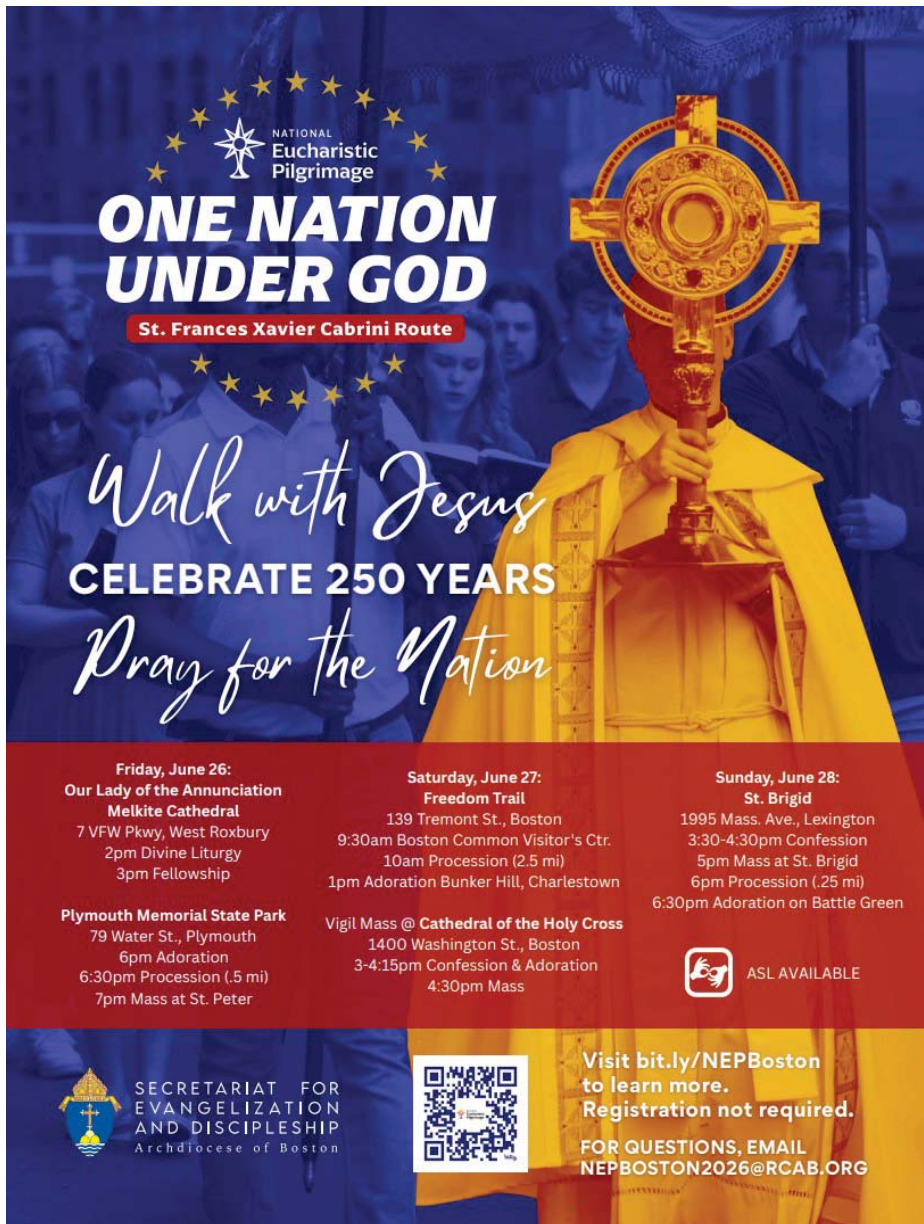
the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique, a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church's traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist the "substance" of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the "accidents" or appearances of bread and wine remain. "Substance" and "accident" are here used as philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith. Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of "accidents" or physical attributes—that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of "substance" or deepest reality). This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "transubstantiation." According to Catholic faith, we can speak of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. Catechism, no. 1376).

Shawls may go to someone suffering from a serious illness or to one who has perhaps experienced a grievous loss. Each shawl comes with a special prayer card that helps to remind the recipient of God's love always.*

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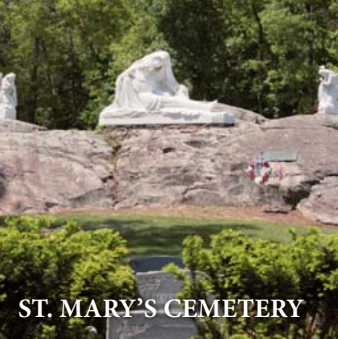
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
