The Liturgy this week continues to instruct us in the elements of discipleship. We're told that even the most humble among us have a share in the mission Christ gives to His Church. We're not all called to the ministry of the Apostles, or to be prophets like Elisha in today's First Reading. But each of us is called to a holy life (see 2 Timothy 1:9; 1 Thessalonians 4:3).

At Baptism our lives were joined forever to the cross of Christ, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle. Baptized into His death, we're to renounce sin and live for God in Christ Jesus.

We are to follow Him, each of us taking up our personal cross, as Jesus says in today's Gospel. That doesn't mean we will all be asked to suffer a martyr's death. But each of us is called to self-denial, to the offering of our lives in service of God's plan.

Jesus must be elevated to first place in our lives—above even our closest bonds of kinship and love. By Baptism, we've been made part of a new family—the kingdom of God, the Church. We are to proclaim that kingdom with our lives, bringing our fathers and mothers, and all men and women to live as “little ones” under the fatherhood of God and the kingship of the Holy One.

We do this by opening our hearts and homes to the service of the Lord, following the Shunnamite woman's example in today's First Reading. As Jesus tells us, we're to receive others—not only prophets, but also little children, the poor and the imprisoned—as we receive Christ himself (see Matthew 18:5; 25:31–46).

As we sing in today's Psalm, we are to testify to His favors and kindness in our lives.

We're to hold fast to the promise—that if we have died with Christ, we shall also live, that if we lose our lives for His sake, we shall find our reward, and walk forever in His countenance.

La liturgia de esta semana continúa instruyéndonos sobre los elementos del discipulado. Se nos dice que incluso los más humildes entre nosotros participan en la misión que Cristo confía a su Iglesia.

No todos estamos llamados al ministerio de los Apóstoles ni a ser profetas como Eliseo, según la primera lectura de hoy. Pero cada uno de nosotros está llamado a una vida santa (véanse 2 Timoteo 1, 9; 1 Tesalonicenses 4, 3).

En el Bautismo, nuestras vidas quedaron unidas para siempre a la cruz de Cristo, tal como nos dice san Pablo en la epístola de hoy. Bautizados en su muerte, debemos renunciar al pecado y vivir para Dios en Cristo Jesús.

Hemos de seguirle, cargando cada uno con nuestra propia cruz, como dice Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy. Esto no significa que a todos se nos pedirá sufrir el martirio; pero cada uno está llamado a la renuncia de sí mismo y a ofrecer su vida al servicio del plan de Dios.

Jesús debe ocupar el primer lugar en nuestras vidas, por encima incluso de nuestros vínculos más estrechos de parentesco y amor. Por el Bautismo, hemos pasado a formar parte de una nueva familia: el reino de Dios, la Iglesia. Debemos proclamar ese reino con nuestra vida, llevando a nuestros padres y madres, y a todos los hombres y mujeres, a vivir como «pequeños» bajo la paternidad de Dios y el reinado del Santo.

Lo hacemos abriendo nuestros corazones y hogares al servicio del Señor, siguiendo el ejemplo de la mujer sunamita de la primera lectura. Como nos dice Jesús, debemos acoger a los demás —no solo a los profetas, sino también a los niños pequeños, a los pobres y a los encarcelados— tal como acogemos a Cristo mismo (véanse Mateo 18, 5; 25, 31-46).

Como cantamos en el salmo de hoy, debemos dar testimonio de sus favores y de su bondad en nuestras vidas.

Hemos de aferrarnos a la promesa: que si hemos muerto con Cristo, también viviremos; que si perdemos la vida por su causa, encontraremos nuestra recompensa y caminaremos para siempre ante su rostro.

"The makers of these special, hand-knit or crochet shawls pray before the shawl is made, pray while working on the shawl, and pray after it is finished. Shawls may go to someone suffering from a serious illness or to one who has perhaps experienced a grievous loss. Prayers that accompany the shawls ask God to help renew the body as well as the spirit. They ask him to restore the recipient to hope, strength, and healing." Each shawl comes with a special prayer card that helps to remind the recipient of God's love always.

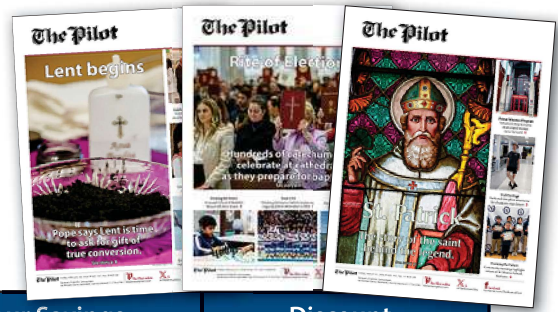

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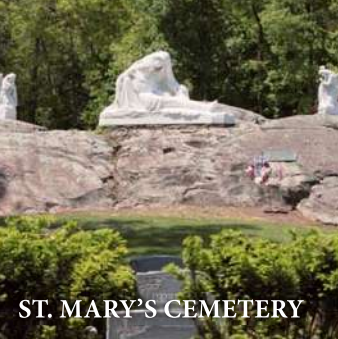
