FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. KOSSE...

"You are the Holy One of God!" Who said that? It was not one of Jesus' disciples. It was not one of the people that were cured by Jesus. Who said it? It was said by an unclean spirit who was casted out of a person by Jesus. An unclean spirit was an evil spirit or the devil. The devil knew who Jesus was. But Jesus did not want it to speak as who he was. He did not want the people trying to make him an all-powerful God, which he was. No! He wanted the people then and

now to see him as a loving and caring God who wants to walk with us. In the first reading for today, Moses spoke of the time that the people of Israel became frightened of God. The mountain shook with fire and smoke. Thus they said, "Let us not again hear the voice of the Lord, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die." Jesus came not to frighten us but to invite us to walk with him. He did not come in power but in mercy. He came not to condemn but to redeem. Every

Sunday we come as his invited guests to dine with him, to hear him speak to us once again, to feel his presence. That is how Jesus wants us to see him. He stands in our midst as a loving brother who has opened up the Kingdom of Heaven. He gave everything so that we may all reside there as heirs, adopted sons and daughters of God, even to the point of dying on the cross for us. Lord Jesus, your love for us is beyond imagination. How great it is be in your presence!

OUR CHURCH HAPPENINGS • News, Honors, Thank Yous

WHAT DO YOU THINK? "When the owner of the vineyard returns," Jesus asked "what do you think he will do to those farmers?" (Matthew 21:40). To conclude His shocking parable of the wicked farmers (Matt. 21:33-46), Jesus suddenly threw the ball into His opponents; court. They were forced by the logic of the story to react, which they did with vigor, denouncing and pronouncing a death sentence upon the wicked farmers and saying the vineyard should be entrusted to more worthy tenants. But their response backfired on them as they realized that they were the usurping tenants on borrowed terrain, ungratefully and ungraciously refusing to honor the terms of their agreement with the owner, God, and plunging headlong in a plot to kill His Son. Throughout this climatic series of encounters near the end of Jesus' earthly ministry, He repeatedly asked His antagonists, "What do you think?" It would be one thing for Jesus, having been rejected over and over by the unrepentant religious establishment at Jerusalem, to pronounce judgment on them. It was a decision He had a perfect right to render, as His parables illustrate. But it was all the more effective for Him to let them reason out the consequences of their rejection and actually articulate it themselves. Jesus gives us clear and reasonable ground upon which He will one day act as judge. He spells out both what He expects and what He offers, and then asks us to consider, "What do you think?" You cannot pretend that you don't understand what Jesus expects and what He offers. The ball is in your court. Where will you go from here?
