FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOSHUA

I will be away from the parishes from 9-20 October for a wedding in Massachusetts and then the Archdiocese for the Military Services Priest Convocation in Rome. During my absence, Msgr. Kosse will be covering the parishes for sacramental emergencies (danger of death), funerals, and Sunday Masses. There will be no daily Confessions or Masses while I am away.

Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with both Fall Fest at St. Catherine's and Fall Dinner at St. Leo's. Both events were very smooth. I am grateful to both Msgr. Kosse and Fr. Silva for covering the Masses at St. Leo's so that I could be with the people at St. Catherine's on Sunday. I was able to actually sit down and visit with some of our families and get to know them a little bit better.

St. Leo's: I love that we have so many young families with their children coming to Sunday Mass. The sound of children at Mass is the sound of a young, growing Church. That being said, I must admit that it is challenging to deliver an effective homily when I have a cherub choir giving an impromptu vocal performance. I never know if I am being heard with our sound system and I do not think increasing the volume of the speakers would be an effective solution. I have been thinking about ways to modify/create a space at the Church where parents can take their children to allow them some space to be kids and the parents can still listen to and participate in the Mass. If you have any ideas or concerns regarding this, please let me or a pastoral council member know.

St. Catherine's: For clarification, the Eucharistic Adoration Chapel will only have the Blessed Sacrament exposed when we have at least two people signed

up for each hour. The Eucharist cannot be left unattended and unsecured. It is Eucharistic Adoration, not Eucharistic Abandonment. Anyone is welcome to come and pray with the Blessed Sacrament that is reserved in the Tabernacle in the main church.

As I am sure many of you already know, the power of the Rosary is a very worthy devotion and should not be underestimated. This week marks the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, formally called Our Lady of Victory. On October 7th, 1571, The Holy League, a group of Christian European Nations bound together in faith and culture achieved a great victory over the Ottoman Empire who were threatening Europe with invasion. In anticipation of this naval campaign in the Mediterranean, Pope Pius V, a former Dominican, called on the entire Church to pray for Our Lady's intercession to save Christian Europe from the Muslim invaders. During the Battle of Lepanto, the only standards that flew above the Christian fleet were an image of Our Lord and Our Lady. Even though the Ottoman Empire's fleet outnumbered the Allied Spanish and Italians, the Christian sailors were victorious, in part due to very favorable winds that are attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mother of God. The victory resulted in 15,000 Christian slaves being rescued from the Ottoman fleet and a great boost in morale for all of Christendom in the face of the ongoing strife of the Protestant Rebellion and the continued aggression of the Ottoman Empire. Let us remember that our prayers to Our Lady are never wasted and that her maternal protection is never far from those who fervently seek her intercession.

Please take a moment to prayerfully consider where you can commit. Each adorer is responsible for finding their own substitute. The sub binder will no longer be used. A new sub list will be distributed once the updated system is in place. Prayer partners are encouraged to communicate and support one another in covering their committed time. We sincerely thank you for your continued devotion and commitment to Adoration. May this new schedule foster deeper unity, prayer, and reverence within our parish. 
