FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOSHUA

I have noticed that there are parishioners leaving the Church after receiving Holy Communion. This is extremely disrespectful not only to me, but it also greatly offends Our Lord. The third commandment obliges Catholics to attend the Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays. Receiving Holy Communion is not required to meet this obligation. In fact, reception of Holy Communion is only required once per year during the Easter Season. In order to meet your Sunday obligation, you must stay in the Church until the final blessing and dismissal. If you leave Mass early for anything less than a legitimate emergency, you have not fulfilled your Sunday obligation and you should not present yourself for Holy Communion until you have confessed your sins to a priest and received absolution.

After my homily last Sunday, I received multiple questions regarding the resurrection of the body and the practice of cremation. This is a very good and important question. The Church's disposition towards cremation as noted in the Code of Canon Law states: "The Church earnestly recommends that the pious custom of burying the bodies of the deceased be observed; nevertheless, the Church does not prohibit cremation unless it was chosen for reasons contrary to Christian doctrine. (Can. 1176 §3.)"

This is a relatively recent development in the life of the Church. Prior to 1963, cremation was only permitted for Catholics in extreme circumstances due to sanitary necessity (plague and exposed bodies during war). In 1969, the Church allowed the committal ritual to be celebrated with cremated remains.

Cremated remains were only allowed to be present at a funeral liturgy beginning in 1997. Cremation is and has been an ancient pagan custom that rejects the resurrection of the body. The Early Roman Empire specifically burned the bodies of the Christian martyrs as a way of attacking their belief in the resurrection of the body. They also did this to prevent other Christians from collecting the earthly remains to be venerated as relics.

In 2016 the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith put out an updated instruction regarding cremation stating among other things:

7. In order that every appearance of pantheism, naturalism or nihilism be avoided, it is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects. These courses of action cannot be legitimized by an appeal to the sanitary, social, or economic motives that may have occasioned the choice of cremation. 8. When the deceased notoriously has requested cremation and the scattering of their ashes for reasons contrary to the Christian faith, a Christian funeral must be denied to that person according to the norms of the law.

Practically speaking, the funeral prayers are written to be said in the presence of the body of the deceased and with the body, the prayers are very awkward. If a person insists that the deceased be cremated, it is best to be done after the funeral and before the committal or interment. Know that you are in my prayers. I know I am in yours. -Fr. Joshua
