FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOSHUA ...

It has come to my attention that there is some confusion in our parishes about the Sacraments. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is only one part of what has historically been called the "Last Rites." The term "Last Rites" refers to the three Sacraments that would most benefit a person before he dies. These are the Sacraments of Penance (commonly known as Confession or Reconciliation), Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist (in this context it is called viaticum, which means food for the journey).

First, the Sacrament of Penance heals a person from their mortal sins and restores them to a state of grace and right relationship with God which had been broken or damaged by sin. Then the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick heals a person of any spiritual illnesses and strengthens them with grace to endure suffering and unite their pain to the suffering of Jesus on the Cross. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick is not reserved only for those who are near death, but for any member of the faithful who is seriously ill. And finally, the Sacrament of the Eucharist, viaticum, nourishes the person's soul with the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. When a person consumes the Sacred Host, they are united with Jesus and He is with them in their final moments before they meet God in the afterlife. In a way, in viaticum, Jesus ushers the faithful into afterlife to meet God the Father.

In the case where a person's medical condition prevents them from making a good confession or from being able to consume the Sacred Host, they are given the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick only, sometimes accompanied with the prayers for the dying and the Apostolic Pardon if appropriate.

If any member of the faithful is seriously ill, please contact the parish office or if it is urgent contact me directly at (507) 283-3663 and request the Sacrament of

the Anointing of the Sick. This includes if the person is going into major surgery and will be under general anesthesia.

The Sacraments are gifts from God for the spiritual benefit of the faithful and not a service or good that we must earn or pay for. The Catholic Church does not charge for the Sacraments. With the exception of Mass Intentions which are regulated by the Diocesan Bishop, there is never a scenario where a priest or any clergy member should receive remuneration for providing the Sacraments to the Faithful. In some cases, there is a "stole fee" to cover the cost of materials and/or the use of Church facilities, but this does not go to the priest.

That being said, in some parts of the world, including many Latin American regions, it is the custom for the Faithful to compensate priests for Sacraments provided because the Church does not provide the clergy with a salary or any financial or material support. In this case it is customary for the priest to ask the faithful for a fee for Sacraments provided because he does not have any other source of income or sustenance. This is not the case in the United States. In the U.S. all legitimate clergy in active ministry are under the authority of a bishop and they are compensated with a salary. If you know of a priest that is charging personal fees for Sacraments, please report that information to the nearest Bishop's office immediately.

Additionally, I have received multiple reports from people who have received text messages from someone pretending to be me. If you receive an email message or a text from me that seems suspicious, please call the parish office immediately to verify the communication. In many cases, these types of attacks are seeking to exhort people for money and/or personal identifying information. Please be vigilant and verify all suspicious communications with a phone call to the parish office.

Know that you are in my prayers during this purifying and penitential season. I know I am in yours. *-Fr. Joshua*

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PR. JOSHUA...

Me he dado cuenta de que existe cierta confusión en nuestras parroquias sobre los sacramentos. El sacramento de la unción de los enfermos es solo una parte de lo que históricamente se ha denominado «últimos ritos». El término «últimos ritos» se refiere a los tres sacramentos que más benefician a una persona antes de morir. Estos son los sacramentos de la penitencia (comúnmente conocido como confesión o reconciliación), la unción de los enfermos y la Eucaristía (en este contexto se llama viático, que significa alimento para el camino).

En primer lugar, el sacramento de la penitencia sana a la persona de sus pecados mortales y la devuelve al estado de gracia y a la relación correcta con Dios, que había sido rota o dañada por el pecado. Luego, el sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos sana a la persona de cualquier enfermedad espiritual y la fortalece con la gracia para soportar el sufrimiento y unir su dolor al sufrimiento de Jesús en la cruz. El sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos no está reservado solo para aquellos que están cerca de la muerte, sino para cualquier fiel que esté gravemente enfermo. Y, por último, el sacramento de la Eucaristía, el viático, nutre el alma de la persona con el Cuerpo, la Sangre, el Alma y la Divinidad de Jesucristo. Cuando una persona consume la Sagrada Hostia, se une a Jesús y Él está con ella en sus últimos momentos antes de encontrarse con Dios en la otra vida. En cierto modo, en el viático, Jesús conduce a los fieles a la otra vida para encontrarse con Dios Padre.

En el caso de que la condición médica de una persona le impida hacer una buena confesión o consumir la Sagrada Hostia, se le administra únicamente el Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos, a veces acompañado de las oraciones por los moribundos y el Perdón Apostólico, si procede.

Si algún fiel está gravemente enfermo, póngase en contacto con la oficina parroquial o, si es urgente, llámeme directamente al (507) 283-3663 y solicite el sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos. Esto incluye los casos en que la persona va a someterse a una cirugía mayor y estará bajo anestesia general.

Los sacramentos son dones de Dios para el beneficio espiritual de los fieles y no un servicio o un bien que debemos ganarnos o pagar. La Iglesia católica no cobra por los sacramentos. Con la excepción de las intenciones de misa, que están reguladas por el obispo diocesano, nunca hay un caso en el que un sacerdote o cualquier miembro del clero deba recibir una remuneración por administrar los sacramentos a los fieles. En algunos casos, se cobra una «cuota de estola» para cubrir el costo de los materiales y/o el uso de las instalaciones de la Iglesia, pero esta no va al sacerdote.

Dicho esto, en algunas partes del mundo, incluidas muchas regiones de América Latina, es costumbre que los fieles compensen a los sacerdotes por los sacramentos que administran, ya que la Iglesia no proporciona al clero un salario ni ningún tipo de apoyo financiero o material. En este caso, es habitual que el sacerdote pida a los fieles una cuota por los sacramentos administrados, ya que no tiene ninguna otra fuente de ingresos o sustento. Este no es el caso en los Estados Unidos. En los Estados Unidos, todo el clero legítimo en ministerio activo está bajo la autoridad de un obispo y recibe una remuneración en forma de salario. Si conoce a algún sacerdote que cobre honorarios personales por los sacramentos, por favor, comunique esa información inmediatamente a la oficina del obispo más cercana.

Además, he recibido múltiples denuncias de personas que han recibido mensajes de texto de alguien que se hace pasar por mí. Si recibe un mensaje de correo electrónico o un mensaje de texto de mi parte que le parezca sospechoso, llame inmediatamente a la oficina parroquial para verificar la comunicación. En muchos casos, este tipo de ataques tienen como objetivo obtener dinero y/o información de identificación personal. Esté atento y verifique todas las comunicaciones sospechosas con una llamada telefónica a la oficina parroquial.

Sepa que usted está en mis oraciones durante esta temporada de purificación y penitencia. Sé que yo estoy en las suyas.



There are Mass Cards available in St. Catherine Office. We are able to accept new intentions on an ongoing basis, as long as we do not book more than a year in advance.
