FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOSHUA

This week I met with both St. Catherine's and St. Leo's Pastoral Councils. I was able to get more acquainted with the parishes and we initiated the process to produce an updated Parish Pictorial Directory. There will be a committee formed with members from both parishes to coordinate the efforts. I also met with the St. Leo and St. Mary Cemetery Associations to get acquainted with our cemeteries and their long term care. I will be meeting with the Cemetery Associations for St. Joseph, St. Catherine, and St. Martin Cemeteries in the coming days. Thank you to all the members of these boards. The care and maintenance of our cemeteries is a beautiful ministry and great way to proclaim the Gospel through the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy: burying and praying for the dead.

This week also marked the first day of school. Soon we will also welcome our children to the classrooms at our parishes for Religious Education and Faith Formation. We are still looking for several Catechists at both parishes. If you have a rich prayer life, an aptitude for working with kids and/or a deep desire to share the Gospel, please prayerfully consider joining the faith formation team. There will be a training session conducted on September 13th at St. Catherine's by an expert Catechist Heidi Indahl from Winona. The training is designed to equip faithful adults to engage with our youth in a way that passes on the faith of our ancestors in both intellectual and relationship modes. God does not call the equipped, but he equips those whom He calls to ministry for the sake of the Kingdom.

I am still waiting for new Holy Communion Pyxes (they are backordered) and other liturgical items to arrive before I announce the date and time for training for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Once all the items have been received, I will ask all those who are currently bringing communion to our homebound and anyone who is interested in becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion to join me for a Sacristy orientation and training on how to pastorally care for our parishioners that are not physically able to join us for Mass. 
SaintSPOTLIGHT

PETER CLAVER was born to a prosperous family in Verdu, Spain, and earned his first degree in Barcelona. He entered the Jesuits in 1601. When he was in Majorca studying philosophy, Claver was encouraged by Alphonsus Rodriguez, the saintly doorkeeper of the college, to go to the missions in America. Claver listened, and in 1610 he landed in Cartagena, Colombia. After completing his studies in Bogotá, Peter was ordained in Cartagena in 1616.

Cartagena was one of two ports where slaves from Africa arrived to be sold in South America. Between the years 1616 and 1650, Peter Claver worked daily to

minister to the needs of the 10,000 slaves who arrived each year.

When a ship arrived, Peter first begged for fruits, biscuits, or sweets to bring to the people who were enslaved. He then went on board with translators to bring his gifts as well as his skills as a doctor and teacher. Claver entered the holds of the ships and would not leave until every person received a measure of care. Peter gave short instruction in the Catholic faith and baptized as many as he could. In this way he could prevail on the slave owners to give humane treatment to fellow Christians. Peter Claver baptized more than 300,000 enslaved people by 1651,



when he was sickened by the plaque.

In the last years of his life Peter was too ill to leave his room. The ex-slave who was hired to care for him treated him cruelly, not feeding him many days, and never bathing him. Claver never complained. He was convinced that he deserved this treatment.

In 1654 Peter was anointed with

the oil of the Sacrament of the Sick. When Cartagenians heard the news, they crowded into his room to see him for the last time. They treated Peter Claver's room as a shrine, and stripped it of everything but his bedclothes for mementos. Claver died September 7, 1654.

St. Peter Claver was canonized in 1888. His memorial is celebrated on September 9.
