FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. KOSSE...

We begin now the holiest of days in the Church. Today we begin with Palm Sunday, a time of receiving the blessed palms which you can then place in your homes as a reminder of what you are called to be, messengers of that great promise given us by Jesus, Eternal Life. Then we move onto what the Church calls, the Easter Triduum, the days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Each day builds onto each other and up to the greatest day, Easter Sunday. That is why there is no sending forth on Holy Thursday or on Good Friday

as we have at every other Mass. The sending forth only happens on Holy Saturday. Taking in each of these days will truly renew the message that Jesus wants you to realize, a message of hope, a message of salvation.

This Monday, I also want to invite you to come to the Chrism Mass that will be celebrated by Bishop Barron. This year, that celebration will be at Sacred Heart Church, Heron Lake, MN at 2:00 PM. It is a beautiful celebration during which the three Oils used in Church are blessed. Those three Blessed Oils are the Oil

of the Catechumen, which is used in Baptism, the Oil called Chrism which is used in Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders, and the Oil of the Infirm which is used in the Sacrament of the Sick. Each parish is given these Blessed Oils and they will be presented at the Holy Thursday Mass. As I mentioned, this year the Chrism Mass will be at Heron Lake. Next year it will be at another parish across our diocese so others many take part in this celebration. So come and take in this great moment that is so close by.



Sister who came to evangelize the Native American tribes in the mission territory of St. Louis, Missouri. She could not learn the native languages so she spent countless hours praying before the Eucharist for the other missionary sisters instead. The Indians gave her the name of "The Woman Who Prays Always."

WHO IS THE MASS FOR? "Pray, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father." These words are spoken every Sunday at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist once the altar has been prepared. I (Bishop Barron) never used to pay attention to this statement, at least not until I was ordained a priest. It was then that I realized that there were different sacrifices being made. "My sacrifice and yours" refers to the spiritual sacrifices we are each able to make on account of our Baptism-the priesthood of the baptized-as well as the physi-cal offering of bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of Christ. Our spiritual sacrifices take many forms. They are all placed on the altar along with the bread and wine to be offered to God. Each of us is able to make a spiritual sacrifice. Our sacrifices can be generic or specific, or you may just offer yourself and your praise. However you make your sacri-fice, the purpose is to unite yourself more closely to God and the Communion of Saints, and for the salvation of souls. (Continued in next week's bulletin)
