FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. KOSSE...

Today we hear the story of Nicodemus who comes to the Lord Jesus. It is believed that Nicodemus was a prominent Pharisee. He came to Jesus to seek the truth. He came with an open mind. And that was all that Jesus needed. It changed his life forever. Nicodemus took the first step and after that Jesus took him down the road that would lead him to eternal life. Jesus wants to take you down that same road that will lead you to salvation. And that road is these forty days of Lent. Each day Jesus is

looking for an open heart. Each day he is looking for hearts that will let him guide you to his truth. He wants to do that because he knows that there are many other so-call truths that are being pushed in the world. They might seem at first okay truths. But when measured with the truth of Jesus, they fall short. One of those false truths is on the areas of Assisted Suicide that we are now hearing in our country and now in our state. There, what is being push is "My life, My Death, My Choice" so-called truth. The real truth

that we are to live is what St. Paul said. "We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord, so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." I inserted an article that Bishop Barron wrote, using those same words, and explaining why as Catholics we need to oppose this thinking of Assisted Suicide and to pray that we respect all life from conception to one's natural death, that truth given by Jesus, that truth that will give us eternal life.



THE ACT OF CONTRITION: The devil has great power to tempt us to sin, however, his power is not infinite (CCC, 395). God has provided a way to break sin's power over us: namely, by repentance. Repentance is the antidote to sin.

To help us spiritually, the Church gives us a prayer we can easily memorize as our way to express repentance. We learned some form of the Act of Contrition in our catechism as children or from our parents.

As you pray this Offering, keep in mind that you are united with the entire Church at prayer, from the most pious nuns and monks in their monasteries to the simplest believers on all five continents:

The Act of Contrition: "O my God, I am sorry for my sins. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you and your Church. I firmly intend, with the help of your Son, to make up for my sins and to love as I should. Amen."

There are slightly different versions of the Act of Contrition, but essentially, any good act of contrition contains these seven elements:

- 1. We express sorrow to God because our sin offends Him specifically.
- 2. We are "heartily" sorry, meaning that our repentance is from the heart, not just a superficial sentiment.
- 3. We hate ("detest") sin because it is the devil's work, not God's. Note that this is not a hatred of ourselves but of our sinful acts.
- 4. We also humbly acknowledge the truth that mortal sin leads us to hell if we do not repent.

- 5. We understand that the love of God is the reason we repent we regret offending Him "who is all good" and deserves a better response from us.
- 6. We make a firm act of the will ("firmly resolve") to get our moral lives back on track and never to sin again. And finally,
- 7. We declare that we cannot overcome sin on our own without the "help of His grace."

SAINT FRANCES OF ROME - Born of wealthy parents, Frances found herself attracted to the religious life during her youth. But her parents objected and a young nobleman was selected to be her husband. The years passed, and Frances gave birth to two sons and a daughter. With the new responsibilities of family life, the

young mother turned her attention more to the needs of her own household. Within a few years a great plague began to sweep across Italy. It struck Rome with devastating cruelty and left Frances' second son dead. To help alleviate some of the suffering, Frances used all her money and sold her possessions to buy whatever the sick might need. When all the resources had been exhausted, Frances went door to door begging.

Later, Frances opened a section of her house as a hospital. Frances became more and more convinced that this way of life was so necessary for the world, and it was not long before she requested and was given permission to found a society of women bound by no vows. They simply offered themselves to God and to the service of the poor. She lived the remainder of her life with the society—serving the poorest of the poor.
