FROM THE DESK OF FATHER JOSHUA...

This weekend students and parents from our Parish are attending the Steubenville Conference at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester. This is a Catholic conference for high school youth. They will listen to inspiring talks from Catholic speakers (including Fr. Leo Patalinghug, the famous "Cooking Priest"), pray with others, have small group discussions, attend daily Mass, have the opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance, participate in Eucharistic Adoration with Praise and Worship music, and have fun with their peers from many other Catholic parishes from around the Midwest.

Next weekend we will be welcoming Fr. Roque Buezas, a priest of the Institute of the Incarnate Word, a missionary religious order from Argentina. He will be offering all the weekend Masses at St. Catherine's and St. Leo's. There will be a second collection for the missionary work that the IVE's conduct throughout the world. The IVE's are present in our own diocese. Their priests run Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Mankato along with a high school seminary. On a personal note, I have worked with IVE priests in Fairbanks, Alaska and I have visited their parishes in the Holy Land as well. The work they do to bring the Light of Christ to very challenging places around the globe is a very important mission of the Universal Church.

Fr. Roque is fluent in Spanish, and he will be available to hear confessions on Sunday before the 1:00 PM Spanish Mass.

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA



On July 14 the church celebrates the feast of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native America to be canonized. Know as the 'Lily of the Mohawks," Kateri lived a life of holiness and virtue, despite obstacles and opposition within her tribe. Kateri was born in Auriesville, New York, in 1956 to a Christian Algonquin woman and a pagan Mohawk chief. When she was a child a smallpox epidemic attacked her tribe and both her parents died. She was left with

permanent scars and impaired eyesight. Her uncle, who had now become chief of the tribe, adopted her and her aunts began planning her marriage while she was still very young. When three Jesuits fathers were visiting the tribe in 1667 and staying in the tent of her uncle, they spoke to her of Christ, and though she did not ask to be baptized, she believe in Jesus with an incredible intensity. She also realized that she was called into an intimate union with God as a consecrated virgin. Kateri had to struggle to maintain her faith amidst the opposition of her tribe who ridiculed her for it and ostracized her for refusing the marriage that had been planned for her. When she was 18, Fr. Jacques of Lamberville returned to the Mohawk village, and she asked to be baptized. The life of the mohawk village had become violent and debauchery was commonplace. Realizing that this was providing too dangerous to her life and her call to perpetual virginity, Kateri escaped to the town of Caughnawaga in Quebec, near Montreal, where she grow in holiness and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

Kateri lived out the last years of her short life here, practicing austere penance and constant prayer. *Continue next column...*

St. Kateri Tekakwitha...

She was said to have reached the highest level of mystical union with God, and many miracles were attributed to her while she was still alive. She died an April 17, 1680 at the age of 24, Witnesses reported that within minutes of her death, the scars from smallpox completely vanished and her face shone with radiant beaty.

Devotion to Kateri began immediately after her death and her body, enshrined in Caughnawaga, is visited by many pilgrims each year. She was beautified by Pope John Paul II in 1980, and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012.
