FROM THE DESK OF FR. JOSHUA...

I have received some questions regarding the distribution of the Precious Blood at Sunday Mass. The main reason that I do not allow the distribution of the Precious Blood is for sanitary reasons. Even with the prudent use of a purificator, the spread of contagious illness is a health risk when multiple people receive from the same cup.

Furthermore, the Catholic Church has always held that the fullness of the Divine Person of Jesus is truly present in both the Precious Body and in the Precious Blood. In centuries past, there have been different attacks against this doctrine. A priest named Nestorius, for whom the heresy Nestorianism is named, claimed that the entirety of the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity was not present in only one species, either the Precious Body or the Precious Blood, but that The Real Presence only existed in the mixing of the Precious Blood and the Precious Body. There is also another related heresy called utraquism which claimed that it is necessary to receive both the Precious Body and the Precious Blood for the salvific effects of the Holy Eucharist to be received. Both of these doctrinal beliefs have been condemned by the Catholic Church as heretical and have no place in a Catholic parish.

CONTINUED FORM THE DESK OF FATHER JOSHUA...

Jesus Christ is Really and Truly Present in the Sacrifice of the Holy Eucharist.

The totality of His Divine Person is contained in each and every Sacred Host that is consecrated at Mass. When you receive the Body of Christ during the Communion Rite at Mass, Jesus is giving you His very self and nothing is lacking. Knowing this to be true, and taking into account the inherent risks of spreading contagious disease among our parishioners, it is in everyone's best interest to distribute only the Precious Body at Mass.

I have also received some questions and comments regarding the use of the chalice veil. The chalice veil is a square cloth that is used to cover the chalice and paten during Mass before the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This liturgical item is a physical manifestation of both Scripture and Tradition. Simply put, things that warrant the use of a veil do so because they are precious. We cover the chalice and paten out of respect for what they (will soon) contain. This is the case in many instances in Scripture, most notably referring to the dwelling place of the Ark of the Covenant, the Holy of Holies (Ex 26:31-34). The veil demarcated a boundary between that which is sacred and that which is profane.

Veils also refer to biblical nuptial imagery. The image of a bride behind her veil conveys the hidden mystery of a woman about to meet her husband (Gn 24:65, Sg 4:1-3). This is another indication of sacredness with the added senses of precious mystery and tender intimacy which the outside world does not participate in. At Mass, the chalice veil is removed at the Offertory as the Altar is prepared. This "unveiling" is an indication of what is about to happen in the culminating point of the Eucharistic Prayer. The Eucharistic Prayer is the unbloody re-making present of Jesus' Sacrifice on the Cross. Just as Jesus completes the act of Sacrificing Himself on the Cross, "the veil of the Temple was torn down the middle" (Lk 23:45). When the chalice veil is removed, we remember this moment in the life of Jesus. Simultaneously, we also remember that Jesus is the Bridegroom (Mt 9:15, Mk 2:19, Lk 5:34) and we are His Bride, the Church. After this "unveiling," we make the most intimate act with God that we possibly can, we receive the Divine Person in Holy Communion. Let us remember this each and every time we make a Holy Communion with The Lord.

SECOND COLLECTION
