

Leadership Council

The Leadership Council convened on October 19, 2025, with the following members present: Pastor Tony Coffman, Malon Burtz, Donna Duffy, Diane Durrin, Liz Farley, Vanessa Goodell, Linda Nelson, Dan Patmore, Mick Rowe, Lori Schaeffer, Clint Vanneman, Bobbi Viedt, Clint Woods, and Judy Mills. Additional attendees included Darla Hadrick, Coni Halverson, Tenlie Rohde, and Kori Pravecek.

The meeting was called to order and began with an opening prayer led by Clint Vanneman.

Linda Nelson moved to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, with Liz Farley seconding. The motion passed unanimously. Mick Rowe then made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, seconded by Malon Burtz, which was also approved.

Pastor Tony provided a summary of recent activities.

The GPS program is currently serving many children. Vanessa requested the purchase of risers for the children to sit on. After discussion, Mick Rowe made a motion to purchase the risers, seconded by Diane Durrin. The motion was approved.

Pastor Tony, with assistance from Clint Woods, has been working with confirmation students. Diane plans to return to confirmation in the first week of November. Coni Halverson and Tenlie Rohde were present for the meeting to fulfill confirmation requirements.

The Silent Auction will begin on November 20th. On October 26th, Outreach will serve Italian food starting at 5:30 PM. Liz Farley noted that some cars were blocking the alley and requested cones be placed there. The Cares group will meet on October 28th to assemble Halloween bags.

The SPR Committee met and voted on Clint Woods for the certified ministry program. The Worship and Finance Committees did not meet in October. Four funerals were held at the church during September, with Pastor Tony officiating three.

The Trustees Committee provided a list of ongoing projects and are awaiting completion of several items. Four new TVs have been purchased for the church. The AV Committee had no issues to report. The Missions Committee did not meet in October. No additional funds were received last week for Texas flooding.

The Council agreed to purchase a gift certificate for the Tideman family in recognition of their work with MYF. Pastor Tony expressed interest in providing grief counseling. Sarah and Tresh Swedlund agreed to lead GriefShare, a thirteen-week program for those experiencing the loss of a loved one. This program will be open to anyone interested in attending. The cost for books, leadership training, and video materials is approximately \$600. Liz Farley moved to purchase the GriefShare program, seconded by Dan Patmore. The motion carried.

Lifeline requested use of the church for their screening program; however, due to several complaints, the church decided not to continue hosting the program. Clint Woods made a motion for the church to pay 75% of the cost for adults wishing to attend faith-based programs, seconded by Lori Schaeffer. The motion carried, with funds to come from camp scholarship resources. An amendment will be added to the funeral policy stating that no signage will be displayed outside the church.

The meeting concluded at 11:35 AM with a closing prayer led by Pastor Tony Coffman. The next Leadership Council meeting is scheduled for November 16, 2025.


