Through art activities, the children created colourful pompom caterpillars, symmetrical butterflies, and playdough butterflies. These activities nurtured creativity, imagination, fine motor skills, and early understanding of symmetry and pattern.

Our butterfly tuff tray provided rich sensory and imaginative play. With green rice, pompoms, cocoons, and butterflies, the children re-enacted the life cycle, practiced storytelling, and engaged in problem-solving with their peers.

All of these experiences encouraged curiosity, exploration, and creative thinking while also supporting social development through collaboration and conversation.

One of the biggest highlights of the month was our fire truck visit. The children's excitement was incredible as they explored the truck. This sparked a lot of imaginative play where the children imagined themselves as real firefighters. play fosters collaboration, imagination, and problem-solving, supporting *Aistear's Communicating* and *Exploring and Thinking* themes, while also building confidence and resilience.
