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OUR PARISH HISTORY

In 1888, St. Mary's Church was dedicated, giving the faithful a sacred place to worship and a visible reminder of God's presence in the heart of Conneaut. Over time, this Parish became a hub of Catholic life, with the founding of a parish school in 1901 and the development of St. Joseph Cemetery, where generations of families laid their loved ones to rest.



As the 20th century unfolded, immigrants from Italy, Ireland, and Finland strengthened the local Church, and St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Parish was founded in 1955, with a school opening in 1959. As local needs shifted, the parishes moved toward unity — sharing a pastor in 1998 and formally merging in 2008.



In 2013, the parish took the name Corpus Christi, expressing the centrality of the Eucharist and the call to be one Body in Christ. Today, serving nearly 750 households, Corpus Christi continues to hand on the faith and carry forward this mission in Conneaut.



WHERE WE ARE TODAY

Corpus Christi Parish today is the living fruit of a journey of unification. Once two parishes, we now gather as one community, one family, and one Body in Christ under the name Corpus Christi. This unity is more than practical; it is profoundly Eucharistic. Just as many grains become one loaf and many members become one body, our parish has become one vibrant home for Catholic life in Conneaut.

Our parish family is blessed with strong Mass attendance, active ministries, and a deep sense of fellowship. There is joy in gathering at one altar, where we draw strength from the Eucharist and are reminded that unity is not simply an idea, but a lived reality among us.

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At the heart of this unity is a reverence for our shared history. The former St. Mary Church holds a special place in many hearts, and its sacred objects are not relics of a closed chapter, but living signs of continuity. By thoughtfully integrating these treasures into our current church, we honor the faith of those who came before us and allow their devotion to continue shaping our worship today.

Our home is showing its age and requires renewal to match the vitality of parish life. The church needs a face-lift, new flooring, fresh paint, and the careful incorporation of St. Mary's sacred objects to restore beauty and dignity.

Looking ahead, we dream of building a new parish gathering space between the church and parish offices — a true center for fellowship, faith formation, outreach, and family life — so future generations may encounter the beauty and life of the Body of Christ at Corpus Christi Parish.

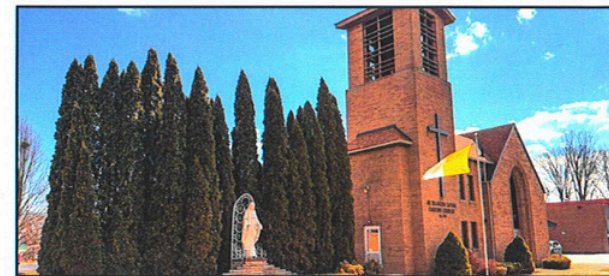
WHERE WE ARE GOING
