TSA approximates that 100 percent of its members are likely to graduate and 75 percent of its members are college bound.

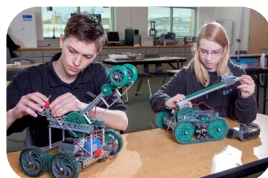
