SCRIPTURE READINGS

Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31 - Wisdom's part in creation

Doth not wisdom cry and understanding put forth her voice? She stands in the top of high places, by the way in the places of the paths. She cries at the gates, at the entry of the city, at the coming in at the doors. Unto you, O men, I call; and my voice is to the sons of man. The Lord possessed me in the beginning of his way, before his works of old. I was set up from everlasting, from the beginning, or ever the earth was. When there were no depths, I was brought forth; when there were no fountains abounding with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills were brought forth: While as yet he had not made the earth, nor the fields, nor the highest part of the dust of the world. When he prepared the heavens, I was there: when he set a compass upon the face of the depth: When he established the clouds above: when he strengthened the fountains of the deep: When he gave to the sea his decree, that the waters should not pass his commandment: when he appointed the foundations of the earth: Then I was by him, as one brought up with him: and I was daily his delight, rejoicing always before him; Rejoicing in the habitable part of his earth; and my delights were with the sons of men.

John 16:12-15 - The Spirit of truth

I have yet many things to say unto you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatever he hears, that will he speak: and he will show you things to come. He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall show it unto you.

Message

The gospel speaks of the "Spirit of Truth." There is wonderful truth as we gather in community. Together we experience the power and delight of the risen Christ. Yet, many of us are frightened by current events and the current state of the church. Some may find community a scary place. We are tempted to take shortcuts and look for easy answers. We are tempted to try to keep things the same. We fear the power of true community. However, for reconciliation, truth must be spoken and then dreams and visions become power and hope. The recovery of Indigenous languages is an example of the importance of the process of reconciliation in community.

You can make trying to understand the concept of the Trinity into a gordian knot which can never be unraveled, and innumerable theologians have debated and disputed the concepts for millennia! I, and every minister to whom you have ever listened, has tried to dissect and explain this theological construct, to make clear this idea on one God in three distinct parts, but also remaining one at the same time. I prefer the KISS approach, Keep It Simple, Silly! God exists for all time, in all places, knowing all, past, present and future. Our human understanding is limited and is only a mere shadow of God's powers. God's Son, Jesus, was sent among us to be one of us while remaining divine and a part of God. He was much more than a prophet, a messenger or a friend. He was holy and human in a manner that is unique in all of recorded history. Jesus died and rose from the dead, leaving his teachings, his commandments, and love behind. On Pentecost the fiery Spirit descended upon all people who would believe and is literally the fire of God's Spirit imbued into our very essence and beings. God claimed and named us before we were born, Jesus loves and is with us through eternity, and motivates, enlivens and propels us into the world to love others, and as I spoke about several weeks ago, to love ourselves, healing all with whom we share the spirit. God in Three Persons, the Holy Trinity. Praise be to God!

Focussing exclusively on the human, worldly plane, we all have fathers, most of whom, but not all, have been with us all of our lives, or who now live on in our hearts and memories. Our basic biology necessitates that we all have a biological father, the contributor of one-half of our DNA, and who, if we are blessed, plays a tremendously significant role in our learning, our attitudes, and all aspects of our upbringing. Those of us who have been alive for more than a half century grew up in a time when the roles of mothers and fathers were distinctly outlined in our society, with mothers taking the largest hands and hearts-on role in our rearing. We gained our unique personalities as a blend of our parental influences and perhaps are still keenly aware of their presence and their influence, and I hope that we can be thankful each day for some elements of their sacrifice, love, and complicated role in guiding we at times very challenging kids into the wonderful beings that we are today. And so, we give thanks with every fiber for their impact on our formation, in every sense of the word!

We may all have a blend of happy and sad memories, of regrets, grudges, or anger, balanced out with joyful remembrances, gratefulness, and love, but always brought to mind with greater empathy and understanding as our logical understanding of parenting and child development have grown, as we too have experienced the parental roles, and as we have continued to spiritually form, become more Christ-like in our love for life, for parents, and for the need to let go of those things which do not make us better people or Christians.

We need to be humbled by the awesome task which everyone and the Trinity of which I have been speaking, filled with wonder at their love and their attempts to balance all the aspects of their lives while raising a family.

We thank you for the church, for all churches, for the rich heritage of the UCC and our predecessors in our spiritual ancestors. We are the present generation, and these celebrations are a call to action, to follow our church's motto into Deep Spirituality, Bold Discipleship, and Daring Justice. May God bless us all on this journey and in this call. Amen.
