Scripture Readings

Psalm 81

Sing out in praise of God our strength; acclaim the God of our ancestors! I am **YHWH**, your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt! But my people did not listen to my voice and Israel would not obey me; so, I gave them over to their willful he arts, to follow their own devices. If only my people would listen to me, if Israel would follow my paths, I would subdue their enemies at once and turn my hand against their persecutors. Those who hate me will come cringing before me and will meet with everlasting punishment. And I will feed Israel with the finest wheat and satisfy you with honey from the rock.

Luke 14: 1, 7-14

One Sabbath, when Jesus came to eat at the house of one of the leading Pharisees, the guests watched him closely. Jesus addressed a parable to the guests, noticing how they were trying to get the place of honour at the table.

"When you are invited to a wedding party, do not sit in the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished has been invited. Otherwise, the hosts might come to you and say, 'Make room for this person,' and you would have to proceed shamefacedly to the lowest place. What you should do is to go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your hosts approach you and say, 'My friend, come up higher.' This will win you the esteem of the other guests. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Then Jesus said to the host, "Whenever you give a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or colleagues or relatives or wealthy neighbours. They might invite you in return and thus repay you. No, when you have a reception, invite those who are poor or who have physical infirmities or are blind. You should be pleased that they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

Hebrews 13: 1-8: 15-16

Continue to love each other as brothers and sisters. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing so some people have entertained angels without knowing it. Keep in mind those who are in prison, as

though you were in prison with them. And be mindful of those who are being treated badly, since you know what they are enduring. Let marriage be honoured by everyone, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled, for God will judge covenant-breakers and adulterers. Put the love of money out of your lives and be content with what you have, for God has said, 'I will never leave you or forsake you.' Thus, we may say with confidence, 'God is my helper, and I will not be afraid; what can mere humans do to me?' Remember your leaders, who preach the word of God to you, and as you reflect on the outcomes of their lives, imitate their faith. Jesus is the same today, yesterday, and forever.

Through Jesus let us perpetually offer God a sacrifice of praise – that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge God's name. Keep doing good works and sharing your resources. These are the sacrifices which please God.

Message Perpetually offer God a sacrifice of praise

When is a good time to acclaim God? Our Scripture readings today exhort us to praise God without ceasing, to sing His praises and to worship Him. So, one might ask, what does it mean to acclaim God? Acclaim means to praise enthusiastically and publicly. Let us consider the two different parts of this definition. I think that we can all come up with our own definition of 'to praise.' So, let's try it now. What are some synonyms for the word praise? *Eg. Acclaim, pay tribute, to admire, to give approval, to share your admiration for someone, to worship, honour, adore, celebrate, bless, give thanks for.*

More importantly, how can we go about doing this? Where and when can we praise God, how do we go about it? It is extremely important to note the second half of the definition, that we must do this praising of God in public, by serving WITNESS to God's awesome nature and character, as revealed to us by the Bible, and Jesus, through our studies of these Words, and by praying for a deeper understanding of God and God's role in our lives, assisted by the interpretations provided for us by Biblical commentators, of whom there are a great many, or by listening to or reading the messages provided by your minister and others who speak in the church.

How do you feel about publicly proclaiming God as your Saviour and Lord? Is it something that comes to you, comes to us, easily? Do we practice praising God on a regular or daily basis? If not, what holds us back? Is it just our usual Canadian shyness and humility, or do we feel shame in doing so, boldly and loudly?

Of course, we know that our actions can often speak louder than our words, so how can and should we act in public, and in our homes and with our families, to exhibit to all what being Christian means to us as we live out our lives?

'For they will know we are Christians by our love.' Jesus said, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35.) The way we love demonstrates who we are. So, I guess that the Scriptures and God challenge and command us to continuously demonstrate on behalf of God, the Father, The Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity, our Trinity. The foundation for our very beings and souls. I wholeheartedly believe that if you wish your life to be fulfilled it must be lived in community with others, with non-judgmental, unconditional love. God's love, or agape.

Agape is a Greek word representing the highest form of love, characterized by a selfless, unconditional, and sacrificial commitment to the well-being of others, even enemies, reflecting God's nature and love for humanity. It is an action of the will, a choice to seek the best for another, rather than a mere feeling. God's divine agape love is often seen as the source from which humans are empowered, through the Holy Spirit, to extend this reciprocal love to one another.

So let us praise God unceasingly, boldly, and confidently. Doing so will uplift our very souls, and draw us into closer communion with people, and therefore God, giving us the ultimate meaning in our lives which God wills for us. Amen.

Keep doing good works and sharing your resources." You command us to adopt a stance of humility, and even more, to feel that humility within, so that we realize deeply that we are but one member of your flock, your people, your tribe. As we enter the season of autumn and thanksgiving, we will continually express our gratitude for all who have faithfully served in your church, here at home, and abroad. As we have recently lost a number of these faithful servants, let us pause now to pray for them: Gerald Atkinson, Jack Page, Evelyn Paterson (WLUC), and for continued healing and recuperation for those who have been ill or hospitalized: Mary Bol, Lois Martin, Don Miller, and all others who have suffered illness over the summer months. In addition, I ask for prayers for two of my sisters, Nancy and Barbara, who are suffering chronic and debilitating illnesses.

Dear Lord, help us all to focus our thoughts and prayers upon these persons, and let us each day set aside our worries and cares for our own selves to think of and express hope and support to all who suffer, those who have suffered loss through fires or floods, and those many families in our communities who have lost a loved one. We also pray in gratitude and joy for the health care workers, the law enforcement personnel, all firefighters and emergency care providers who strive to keep us safe at home, on the roads, on the water, in our hospitals and care homes. We pray for the Corneil family and all who work at Cotrac, who have suffered such a traumatic, sudden loss, and send our support to all there, and all who have suffered job insecurity, food insecurity, and loneliness. There is so much suffering and pain in our world, and only You can truly and permanently heal all wounds and provide peace and healing in losses of the things and people whom we love.
