- L: The Spirit whispers to our hearts, to our longing, to our seeking. It encourages, inspires, dares, unites, and equips.
- P: The Christ candle is lit and our spirits respond with similar tiny flickers. Reaching out for signposts to guide us, we gain a perspective of all those flickers among us, the light of Christ in our midst.

Acknowledgement of the Land I was asked the other day why we start some services every month with an Acknowledgement of the Territory. It's interesting that some, not all, Indigenous Nations in Canada, when they are visiting another Nation's Territory, the visiting person would do some version of an Acknowledgement when they greet their hosts. This is a sign of respect.

When the Truth and Reconciliation Report came out in 2015, the United Church came out in support of the document and the 94 Calls to Action. The Acknowledgements are meant to: recognize the Treaty Land or unceded Territory that the non-Indigenous population inhabits. But it's not supposed to stop there. Call to Action #59 states, "We call upon church parties to the Settlement Agreement (that's us) to develop ongoing education strategies to ensure that their respective congregations learn about their church's role in colonization, the history, and legacy of residential schools." So, another important part of an Acknowledgement is to have a couple sentences of history or other information in the Acknowledgement so that non-Indigenous people have an opportunity to learn, un-learn, and then act.

-In his message Pastor Don started again with the passage from Genesis: "In the beginning . . ." there was nothing and God created it all.
