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PRINCIPAL'S STATE OF THE SCHOOL MESSAGE

Saint Therese Catholic School is planning for the future with optimism. Enrollment is on the forefront of thoughts as we are rebuilding and rebranding our school culture and climate. We have much support for our school in the parish community. The strategic plan has been invaluable in helping to ensure the vision and goals of Saint Therese Catholic School and the Saint Therese Catholic Church Parish communities were reflected in the decisions made moving forward. Some of the highlights and accomplishments:

Curriculum

- All teachers are updating their frameworks to be used in lesson planning based on State Frameworks, State Standards, Diocesean Frameworks, and National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools.
- We have adopted a new Science curriculum for grades 5-8 (FY 2024-2025)
- We have adopted a new English Language curriculum for K-8 (FY 2025-2026)
- We have adopted a new Math curriculum for K-5 (FY 2025-2026)

Catholic Identity

- Students are able to participate in two Masses per week, and grade 8 goes three times a week
- Three Religious Sisters on staff
- First Friday Family Mass
- One professional development meeting per month is dedicated to adult formation for the staff
- Family groups/Prayer partners across all grades
- One group of staff has started Discipleship Quads, which will then create more within the staff

A BRIEF HISTORY

Father Herman Schoudel was assigned to begin plans for a new parish in the Wayndale area in 1946. In 1948 the parish acquired a surplus military chapel from the Bear Field Army Air Base and the church was dedicated on October 3, 1948, the feast day of Saint Therese of Lisieux. There started to be talks of building a school and it was Father Albert who gave the go-ahead to James McCarron to begin planning the unique semi-circular, two-story school building.

In 1955, the school officially opened with its first students housed in a building with only two classrooms, a sanctuary, two lavatories, and a small office. The first students were educated by the Sisters of Saint Francis of Perpetual Adoration from Mishawaka. Sisters have served as teachers and principals at the school throughout its history. On June 22, 1958, ground was broken for St. Therese School, a Franciscan school which was built during the summer and opened October 13, 1958. Both the parish and school grew and in 1964 two additional classrooms had to be built to make room for the increased number of students.

During the 1958-1959 school year, the school opened with grades 1-6. Grade 7 was added for the 1959-1960 school year and grade 8 for the 1960-1961 year. A kindergarten class was added during the 1981-1982 school year and later a Pre-K class during the 2008-2009 school year, thus giving St. Therese School its PK-8 grade configuration. The school's current enrollment is 83 and has fluctuated over the last few years.

Sister M. Emmarita, a member of the Sisters of St. Francis, was the first principal at St. Therese School and had a teaching staff of three for grades 1-6. Sister Emmarita served as the school's principal for the first six years that St. Therese School was in operation. The Sisters of St. Francis staffed the school from the beginning until the 1985-86 school year when Sister M. Elaine Brothers, Principal, and Sister M. Helen Ann Jakeway, Grade 6 teacher left St. Therese School, as their order found they could no longer staff all the schools that they operated.

Chuck Grimm served as the long term principal until he passed away in the 2015-2016 school year. His successor, Jeanette Donovan also passed away suddenly in the same year. The school was then led by principal and former technology teacher Nick Bobay. After two years, Rick Ruhl was named as principal of St. Therese from 2019 - 2024. Currently, Michelle Dellinger, who had been an active school board member, parent, and parishioner has taken on the role of building principal and proceeds to adjust and adapt the school towards set goals and milestones.




Free/Reduced Lunches

IREAD-3


We have been developing interventions for our students that do not pass the IRead the first time. We have only had a very small number receive a good cause exemption, and most others were close to passing on the first attempt, and with targeted remediation and additional instruction have been able to pass during the second and third testing windows.

Strengths

1. After years of decreasing scores, our new interventions are starting to have an uptick in our test scores for ELA.

Areas for Improvement

- 1. Academic vocabulary that is used on the tests.
- 2. Number sense and reasoning.
- 3. Writing full paragraphs.

Analysis of Data

Saint Therese scores show a decreasing trend. New interventions and the hiring of a math teacher is necessary for improvement. With a new curriculum for ELA and Math, the hiring of a certified math teacher, and having professional learning opportunities over intervention and student centered activities, we are making every effort to increase our test scores. Our students in math classes have been testing two grade levels below, and interventions through Title 1, special education, and classroom interventions have been implemented. With ELA, we have interventions of a literacy coach, Title 1, special education, academic success time, and in class interventions have been implemented. We are also starting coaching cycles with the literacy coach or the principal to help our teachers in

areas of struggle.

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Based on many decisions and review of best practices and online options, several changes have been made for the 2025-2026 school year interventions related to the goals of improving literacy and mathematics across the curriculum. This year we have hired a literacy coach to support our staff and students. We also have Title 1 tutors from FWCS and EACS working with identified students on ELA and math skills. We also have a teacher that meets with special needs students on ELA, math, and basic skills.

The Indiana School Improvement Plan is designed to be comprehensive and for continuous improvement. Systemic use and consistent reflection are encouraged to update the status of the goals in order to make school improvement continuous and actionable.

Curriculum

Aspiring for academic excellence demands that students are taught to seek the truth, make moral decisions, and integrate faith into their lives. By engaging students in rigorous instruction and employing up-to-date resources, Saint Therese School provides a quality education that is rooted in the Catholic Faith, meets state and national standards, and focuses on the needs of the whole child – spiritually, academically, physically and socially.

Recent conversations in committee and with staff have identified the following strengths and weaknesses at Saint Therese Catholic School:
