

Safe Environment Requirements for Clergy, Employees and Adult Volunteers

Before engaging in diocesan, parish and school-sponsored activities for minors and vulnerable adults, all clergy, employees and adult volunteers are required to be in compliance with the diocesan Safe Environment Requirements which include:

1) A Background Screening, 2) Safe Environment Training, and 3) a Code of Conduct.

The Code of Conduct is required annually and is made available at the beginning of each fiscal year, July 1. The Code of Conduct can be accessed through the diocesan webpage https://dioscg.org/child-youth-protection/ and through VIRTUS: https://www.virtusonline.org/virtus/.

The Code of Conduct is to be read, signed, and submitted to the local Safe Environment Coordinator at the parish or school: that's me, Deacon Dan, your parish compliance officer.

For new employees and volunteers, to begin the process, an account must first be created in VIRTUS. There the Background Screening Application will be prompted and is now completed online through their VIRTUS account. The training, which includes "Protecting God's Children" and "Mandated and Ethical Reporting", are accessible through their VIRTUS account and are also completed online.

Religious Freedom Week 2025: June 22- June 29 Witnesses to Hope

Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. Beginning June 22, the feast of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, the USCCB invites Catholics to pray, reflect, and act to promote religious freedom.

June 22: Political Polarization: Pray that Catholics will have the courage to put the truth of the gospel and fidelity to the Church above partisan politics.

June 23: IVF Mandates: Pray for couples who suffer fertility challenges, and that political leaders would promote therapies that respect the dignity of all human persons.

June 24: Catholic Healthcare: Pray that governments will respect the consciences of all people who care for the sick and vulnerable.

June 25: Nicaragua: Pray for Christians in Nicaragua, where the Catholic Church faces brutal government persecution.

June 26: Parental Choice in Education: Pray that governments would strengthen the ability for parents to direct the education of their children.

June 27: Immigration Services: Pray that the Lord would protect vulnerable migrants and refugees, and that the Church enjoy the freedom to carry out the ministries that Christ has handed to her.

June 28: Freedom to Serve the Common Good: Pray that government leaders would recognize the contributions that religious charities make to the common good.

June 29: Nigeria: Pray for our brothers and sisters in Nigeria who are suffering violent religious conflict.

Attempting to understand the mystery of the Trinity



The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith, representing the belief in one God who exists in three distinct Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. While we cannot fully understand it, this teaching is foundational to Catholic theology, worship, and the spiritual life of the faithful. It reflects the very nature of God as revealed in Scripture and developed through centuries of theological reflection.

Even though the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct, they are united. They share the same essence, the same substance. This means they are one in being. They are not three separate gods but one God in three persons. This unity is a mystery we believe through faith.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains this well.

The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire: "The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e. by nature one God." CCC 253

This means all three are fully God, sharing the same nature. The Father is the creator of all things. He is the source of everything. The Son, Jesus Christ, became man to save us. He shows us God's love and mercy. The Holy Spirit is our helper and guide. He gives us strength and wisdom.

Knowing about the three persons of the Trinity helps us relate to God better. We can see how each person of the Trinity plays a part in our lives. This understanding deepens our faith and helps us grow closer to God.

Images and analogies can help us better understand the Trinity.

One such way is thinking of the Trinity as 'Lover, Beloved, and Love'. St. Augustine famously used this analogy to help explain the relationship within the Trinity. This analogy suggests the Father is the Lover, the one who loves. The Son, Jesus, is the Beloved, the one who is loved. The Holy Spirit is the Love that flows between the Father and the Son. This shows us that God is a relationship of perfect love. However, St. Augustine also cautioned that no analogy can fully capture the mystery of the Trinity, as God's nature surpasses human understanding.

Another image of the Trinity is 'Formlessness, Form, and Energy'. The Father is Formlessness, the source of all things. The Son, Jesus, is Form, who became human and showed us God's love. The Holy Spirit is the Energy, the living force that moves and inspires us. This shows us that God is the force behind all creation. This image helps us understand that God is active in the world.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity lies at the heart of our Catholic faith. Understanding the Trinity helps us understand God better. It shows us that God is not distant but close to us. It teaches us that love and relationships are important. While words and analogies fall short of fully explaining this divine mystery, the doctrine of the Trinity remains a source of deep faith, guiding us in our worship, prayer, and daily life. By embracing this mystery, we find the fullness of God's revelation and His enduring presence in the world.

Shirley's funeral Mass date will be sometime in late August. Final details pending.








