Listening for Wisdom

Theme Conversation

Have you ever felt small, weak and overwhelmed and didn't know
what to say to God.

Sometimes we think our prayers need to be perfect or filled with big words. But you know what, the strongest and most powerful prayers come from your heart.

Today the grownups are going to talk about psalm 86 and this psalm teaches us that God is always listening. We could be thinking happy thoughts or sad ones, nice thoughts or mean ones, God hears them all.

This psalm reminds us that we can talk to God if we are feeling worried or scared, and it also reminds us that God is faithful, forgiving and full of love.

It reminds us that it is very important to keep God at the center of our lives, and if we do that we will always feel safe.

We need to talk to God every day and trust that he will always love us and forgive us. This psalm gives us permission to bring all our fears and worries to God because he is always listening to us and caring for us.

Finally this psalm reminds us to live with gratitude, it reminds us that even if we are worried or scared, we have many blessings that we should thank God for every day. Remember your prayers don't have to be fancy and you don't have to use big words, it just has to come from your heart.

Reflection I am Poor and Needy

When I was a kid, I enjoyed watching westerns on TV. It seemed that no matter how much trouble the hero got into, he would always be saved by the Cavalry.

Today, as an adult, life sure seems to be full of trouble. It seems that no matter what we do, we have trouble of some kind, but there doesn't seem to be men on horseback racing to save us.

A wife told her husband that there was trouble with the car. She said it had water in the carburetor. He said that was ridiculous. Nevertheless, she insisted that there was water in the carburetor. He said she didn't even know where the carburetor was, but he would check it out. He asked her where the car was, and she responded in the swimming pool.

JOB 5:7 says,

"Yet man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward."

When the golf ball was first invented, it was smooth on the outside like a big ping pong ball. But it was soon discovered that the more the ball got roughed up on the golf course, the further it would travel. So the factory was instructed to start putting the ball under a great deal of pressure when they were making it. This pressure causes all the dimples you see on them, and those dimples cause the ball to travel much further than a ball that has not been under pressure.

As Christians, sometimes we find that we do our best work when put under pressure. I know that is certainly true for me. I find for myself,

working under pressure makes me feel closer to God, comforted by his presence,

The Psalmist, David, knew about how tough life could get.

PSALM 86:1-4 tells us,

‘Hear, O Lord, and answer me, for I am poor and needy. Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in You. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to You all day long. Bring joy to Your servant, for to You, O Lord, I lift up my soul.’

David says; Hear my prayer - Guard my life - Have mercy on me - Increase my joy. Let's review these things as they are still relevant in our lives today..

David says,

“Hear, O Lord, and answer me, for I am poor and needy.”

A woman was at work when she received a phone call that her daughter was sick. She left work and stopped by the pharmacy to get some medication. She returned to her car to find that she had locked the keys inside the car when she went into the pharmacy.

The woman looked around and found an old rusty coat hanger that had been thrown down on the ground, possibly by someone else who also had locked their keys in their car. Then she looked at the hanger and said, "I don't know how to use this." So she bowed her head and asked God to send her some help.

Within five minutes an old rusty car pulled up in the parking space next to her car. An older, rough looking man got out and asked if he could help her. The woman thought, "This is what you sent to help me, God???"

She told him yes, she was in a hurry and needed to get home. He walked over to the car, and in less than one minute the car was opened. She hugged the man and through her tears she said, "Thank you so much! You are such a nice man."

The man replied; "No, actually I'm not. I just got out of prison for car theft." The woman hugged the man again and with sobbing tears cried out to God, "You even sent me a professional."

You just never know how God is going to answer your prayers. I always heard it said that God answers prayer in four ways:

- Yes
- No
- Later, and
- You're kidding, right?

But no matter how He answers them, God hears every prayer that is spoken by His children. His children are those who have made a choice to follow Jesus as their Savior.

MATTHEW 7:7-8, tells us,

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened."

In JAMES 4:2, we are told,

"You do not have, because you do not ask God."

David continues with,

"Guard my life, for I am devoted to you. You are my God; save your servant who trusts in you."

Everyone has an occasional 'bad-hair' day, and we all get stressed out from time to time in this day and age. We all deal with a certain amount of stress in life and much of it comes from those who are around us. We need help, but more than anything we need divine guidance. Amazingly divine guidance comes to us when we make time for prayer.

We need God to guard our lives and help us. But to get God's help, we must be devoted to His Son. This can be a problem for some. How devoted to Jesus are you? How much do you trust him?

A Presbyterian Minister from the 1700's, Matthew Henry, once said,

“Well armed against the strongest temptation are they who are filled with the Holy Spirit.”

Christians – baptised, believing in God, following in the steps of Jesus Christians, will be protected by God. When the day comes when you bow before the throne of God, -your mark of acceptance will be your Holiness. Not your wealth. Not how smart you were, or who you knew, but your faith in Jesus Christ. Take time to pray and talk to God, take time to listen.

How many times in our lives have we gotten angry with somebody and have carried that anger and relived that anger day after day? Perhaps they did something very hurtful to you and you feel that you are entitled to that anger. I know that feeling, I have experienced that anger.

Anger will destroy you, suck out all your joy but will do nothing to the person who wronged you. Remember how much Jesus has forgiven you. How many sins, big or small are you guilty of throughout your life. When you went to Jesus in prayer and asked for forgiveness, it was given. Forgiving the person who wronged you and praying for them will surprisingly give you peace and joy. We don't deserve the love Jesus gives us and we certainly can't earn it, but he gives it anyway because he is a merciful God.

You are never to be a giver of condemnation but always a giver of mercy, because that is what God gave you. Mercy is forgiveness - soaked in the love of God.

David continues with

“Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I call to you all day long.”

Whether we would admit it or not, we all sin although we can come up with very creative reasons justifying it. Let me ask you a question. Have you ever run a red light, not like really red but just fresh red where breaking hard would be required? Have you ever borrowed a pen promising to bring it back but you don't. Have you ever forgotten to scan something at the store but you don't go back because they make enormous amounts of money? It doesn't matter

how you justify it, if you did it, that's a sin. It may not seem like much to us but it is to God.

ROMANS 3:23 confirms this.

'... we have all sinned and come short of the glory of God.'

This brings us back to prayer. We need to confess our sins, no matter how small, and ask for forgiveness.

And then finally David says

"Joy is an evidence of the presence of God in your life."

If you are filled with the Spirit of God, then this fruit of the Spirit will be obvious in your life. If we keep focused on God rather than the world, we can still keep our joy. True joy comes from a relationship with the Lord who created us. He alone produces joy in us. And He will increase our joy if we continue to trust Him and follow Him.

It is in these times of great stress we must remember that, just like those cowboys on TV so many years ago, we also have the Calvary coming to our rescue. And the person leading the rescue is none other than Jesus- our Savior. The Cross of Calvary is leading the Cavalry. Amen
