Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.

To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of powerful deeds, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

REFLECTION

When you think about stewardship, the first thing that comes to mind is probably money, and while that's certainly important, it's not the whole story. Biblical stewardship is often described as the three T's – time, talent, and treasure.

Stewardship is more than our treasure. God gives us many gifts, including time and talent, and we're called to give back a portion of them if we're to be truly faithful stewards. We've been given skills and talents that God wants to use for his kingdom. Paul, as Brad read, lists the many skills and talents that God has given.

So, with that in mind – are you giving back a portion of your talents to God's kin-dom? You might not think you have any talents to contribute, but that's never the case. We all have skills and abilities that God can use.

It's probably not a coincidence that when Jesus called the 12 disciples, many of them own and operated businesses as tradesmen and commercial fishermen. It would only be reasonable to assume that the disciples used their contacts and past relationships to spread the news about Christ.

So we all have God-given talents. Are you good with children? Those skills can be put to use in the children's church or babysitting for a single parent in your neighbourhood who needs a break. Maybe you're good at repairing cars, or you're a great cook, or you like to paint. Or maybe you have time you can spend with an elderly shut-in down the street.

Putting time and talents to work for others not only fulfills your calling for stewardship, but it also provides a great witnessing opportunity by reflecting the love of Christ. So don't think you have nothing to give. God can use just about anything to advance His Kingdom. If you're generous with your time and talents as well as your treasure, you'll no doubt one day hear the words, "Well done, good and faithful steward. Enter into the joy of your master."
