THE DETAILS

Workshops and group reflection will be held in White Pine Lodge meeting room and dining hall, and Sunday worship outside, weather permitting. Quilters are free to explore the campgrounds, including the outdoor labyrinth, TransCanada Trail and waterfront.

MEALS: Six meals (Friday supper to Sunday lunch) are included.

Note: If you have special dietary needs, let us know when you submit your registration form (by September 15).

ACCOMMODATION: Bedrooms in White Pine Lodge and Beaver Lodge bedrooms have a variety of twins, bunks and doubles, and shared bathrooms. (Let us know if you can manage an upper berth!) There are limited ground floor rooms. One pillow and bottom sheet are provided for each bed. Participants must bring their own bed and bath linens, including a blanket (OR QUILT!!!)

CARPOOLING: Let us know if you can provide a ride for anyone, or if you need a ride and we will try to match you up with a driver.

COST: Friday to Sunday \$250 per participant includes some quilting supplies, food and accommodation.

LET'S MAKE FABRIC FROM SCRAPS

Crumbs, strings, chunks, slabs, bricks, orphan blocks and more. Turn them into something useful.

It is play time with bits and pieces and colours.

We are quilters—beginners to experts—who gather each fall to spend a weekend sewing, learning, sharing, and enjoying the colours of the Gatineau Hills and the quiet lakeside. Our quilting retreat weekend is spent creating projects for ourselves and baby quilts for St. Mary's Home. New techniques and skills are taught and shared; friendships are renewed and strengthened. All are welcome.

The Presbyterian Church's Gracefield Christian Camp & Retreat Centre is located 90 km north of Ottawa in the upper Gatineau Valley. We will be staying in White Pine Lodge and Beaver Lodge which have shared bedrooms (some accessible) with shared washrooms.

WHAT TO BRING?

We will have a few options for you to create a quilt using up all those extra bits of fabric or orphan blocks you might have. Choose one of our projects, or build your own. If you have a favourite project from a previous retreat that you would like to make again, let us know. We will also, optionally, have fabric, orphans and scraps available to make heart baby quilts for One Plane Away. How about learning how to sew on a binding? Or do improv piecing? Maybe try curves?

Basic fabric requirements: This is an opportunity to clear out your scrap baskets and create something new. Bring whatever fabric scraps or bits and pieces that might be appropriate for baby quilts. Flannelette for backings is always useful.

- ▼ If you will be donating your quilt to St? Mary's or One Plane Away, some backing fabric and batting are available.
- ♥ There will be a scrap-sharing table. Bring some, take some.
- Please wash and press fabrics before arriving at Gracefield.

BABY QUILTS FOR ST. MARY'S HOME

As usual, we will also spend time creating simple quilts for new moms and their babies. Working individually or in groups, participants can experiment with new techniques and/or use a basic pattern. These quilts are usually "tied" and completed by the end of the weekend. If you want to machine quilt and have a walking foot for your machine, bring it. We will also talk about binding. Our current fabric stash includes a few UFOs (unfinished objects), as well as quite a bit of yardage awaiting your creative touch. (For more info: http://www.stmaryshome.com)

For the baby quilts: (these are optional donations)


- ♥ Prewashed 100% cotton fabric to use and/or to donate
