THE INVITATION:

PRAYER OF CONFESSION:

(ALL) Almighty and merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed. We have not loved you with our whole heart, we have failed to be an obedient church, and we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

We repent of our sins and ask for your mercy. Forgive our sins, pardon us of all that is in our past, and help us to follow you in new life to the glory of your name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

WORDS OF PARDON:

(L) God has promised forgiveness to all who repent and turn in faith to him. May the Lord have mercy on you, pardon and deliver you from sin, strengthen you to live as children of God, and bring you to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE OFFERING OF PEACE:

(L) God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. The peace of God be with you.

(All) And with your spirit.

(L) As forgiven and reconciled people, let us offer the peace of Christ to one another.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING:

(L) The Lord be with you.

(ALL) And also with you.

(L) Lift up your hearts.

(ALL) We lift them up to the Lord.

(L) Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

(ALL) It is good and right to give him thanks and praise!

(L) It is right to give thanks to you, Almighty God. You are the source of all life, love, and truth. You made us in your own image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we rebelled and turned away from you, your love remained steadfast. You delivered us from captivity, made covenant to be our sovereign God, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore, with all the company of heaven, we praise you and sing glory to your name:

(ALL) Holy, holy, holy! God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory! Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!

(L) All praise and glory is yours, Almighty Father, for in your mercy you sent your only son Jesus Christ into the world. Your Spirit anointed him to bring good news to the poor, to bind up the brokenhearted, to comfort those who mourn, to proclaim freedom for captives, to set at liberty all who are oppressed, and to announce the year of the Lord's favor.

In obedience to your will, he offered himself on the cross as a sacrifice for the sins of the whole world. Through his life, death, and resurrection, he broke the powers of Sin and Death and ascended to the place of highest honor at your right hand in glory. Because of Him, we can come before you with confidence.

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, gave thanks for it, and broke it. He then gave it to his disciples saying: *Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.*

After the supper, Jesus took the cup; and when he had given thanks to you, he gave it to them saying: *Drink this, all of you; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.*

Therefore, together we proclaim the mystery of faith:

***(ALL) Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.***

(L) Heavenly Father, sanctify these gifts of bread and wine that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit make us one with Christ and one as your church, that Christ may dwell in us and we in him. We ask this through your Son, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory forever.

(ALL) Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

(L) And now, with the confidence of children of God, let us pray:

(ALL) *Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.*
