Every Wednesday, the literacy students are supported by community partnerships with Community Living Espanola and a long-established Learning Partners program with (volunteers in the classroom) Kim Bressan and Claire Poirier. We also had the assistance of a Developmental Social Worker placement Student, Jessica Martin, help virtually as part of the requirements to graduation.

Community Living Espanola opens the door to their kitchen, to their staff, and provides opportunities for their clients that are enrolled in the literacy program under the Get SET program, including Find and Use Information, Communicate Ideas and Information, Understand and Use Numbers, Use Digital Technology and Engage with Others.

The students encounter blended learning opportunities from a supportive team that takes place through on-line sessions, hands-on sessions, and "family style" sitdown meal sessions.



To celebrate the Chinese New Year at Community Living Espanola, the students made homemade eggrolls, rice and a prosperity friendship stir fry (everyone brought a vegetable to put in the pan).

They learned about the Chinese culture over a couple of zoom lessons in the early part of the month. The meal was eaten with chopsticks (another learned skill), jasmine tea and fortune cookies.
