fresh starts & bright ideas

At Confederation College, education opens doors. Sometimes, those doors are literal—like the newly-painted one on the Elizabeth Fry home. Other times, they open to the future, giving students a chance to move forward with confidence and explore new opportunities.

In 2022, the Upgrading Program at Confederation College applied for and received Skills for Success project money to provide upgrading off campus. We wanted to go to where the (potential) students were, rather than expecting them to come to us. And thus, the Hubs programming was born.

We experimented with different housing developments and service providers. Some of these have proven to be so successful that, even without the project funding, we have continued to offer programming. Elizabeth Fry (EFSNWO) is one of those gems

Over the past few months, students in the Elizabeth Fry Society's Adult Upgrading class were busy developing new skills, starting with an online Safe Food Handling course. Then the students engaged in a fun blending of hard and soft skills which we called "Furniture as Art." One transformed a shelf, another tackled a house door.
