Itinerary Overview

Saturday, October 10 - Split

Welcome to Split! Your journey begins in the city's beautiful harbor, where boarding is available throughout the day. While cabins are ready after 1:00 p.m., early arrivals are welcome to leave luggage on board and set out to explore the vibrant streets of this Adriatic gem.

At 7:00 p.m., gather for a welcome reception with the Cruise Director, Captain, crew, and your fellow travelers—soon to be new friends for the week ahead. A festive Welcome Dinner will follow at 7:30 p.m. For guests arriving later in the evening, a light cold dinner will be waiting on board. (D)



Sunday, October 11 - Split to Trogir

Begin your day with a guided walking tour of Split, exploring the extraordinary Diocletian's Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the best-preserved monuments of Roman architecture. Split is the second largest urban centre in Croatia and the seat of the Split and Dalmatia County. It is traditionally considered to be over 1,700 years old. Since 1979 the historic centre of Split has been inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage Site List. The historical and cultural buildings are located inside the walls of the Diocletian's Palace.

At 12:00 we will start our cruise to Trogir, a small town that is on the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Heritage. Lunch will be given while we cruise there with a swim stop. In the afternoon you will arrive to this small town-museum, with its stone-houses, palaces, churches, monasteries, towers, walls and especially the main attraction in Trogir – the Cathedral of St. Lawrence, probably the finest example of sacral architecture in Croatia. After a guided walking Trogir city tour, you will be left to your evening in this unique city full with cosy restaurants. (B,L)



Monday, October 12 - Trogir to Bol to Hvar



Set sail this morning for the town of Bol, said to have the best beach for swimming in Croatia named Zlatni Rat. (Golden cape). We will stop in Bol and enjoy this nice Dalmatian town for a walk, or to have a cup of coffee and take a swim till lunch is served on board. After lunch we will continue cruising towards the sunniest island of Croatia – the island of Hvar, along many coves and bays on the way. Hvar is one of the most popular, very attractive tourist destinations and a meeting point for the international jet set.

Upon your afternoon arrival at Hvar, a local guide will walk you throughout the town introducing you to the history, culture and way of life on this island and explain how lavender was traditionally farmed on the Island of Hvar for centuries. Have an evening in Hvar free on your own to explore and dine around in one of numerous family owned restaurants. (B,L)

Tuesday, October 13 - Hvar to Biševo (Blue Cave) to Vis

This morning, cruise to the tiny island of Biševo, home to the world-famous Blue Cave. The cave has its own natural entrance which is located below sea level, which required that its visitors dive deeply only to resurface into the cave's mysterious blue depths. This natural phenomenon creates a magical effect of deep blue and shiny silver, mystifying her visitors.

Afterward, continue to the island of Vis and enjoy lunch on board. Long closed to the public due to its role as a military outpost, Vis has remained untouched by mass tourism and retains a rare, authentic charm. Its unspoiled beaches, preserved nature, and traditional architecture make it one of the Adriatic's hidden gems. In the afternoon, we will walk to the Lipanović family cellar and savor a wine tasting. This is a chance to experience the island's proud winemaking traditions.

Back on board, gather with fellow travelers for a Captain's Dinner to close the evening. (B,L,Wine Tasting,D)



Wednesday, October 14 - Vis to Korčula

Depart Vis this morning and cruise toward the island of Korčula, pausing along the way for a refreshing swim stop. Lunch will be served on board before arriving in the afternoon at Korčula Town.

Known as the birthplace of famed explorer Marco Polo, Korčula enchants with its medieval charm, narrow cobblestone streets, and red-roofed houses framed by ancient city walls. A guided walking tour will introduce you to the town's rich history and cultural treasures.

The evening is yours to discover one of Korčula's inviting restaurants and enjoy the flavors of the island at your own pace. (B,L)



Thursday, October 15 - Korčula to National Park Mljet to Slano

We begin our morning with a scenic cruise to Mljet National Park, arriving around 10:00 a.m. You'll have time to explore the park—stroll around the Great and Small Lakes and the tiny islet of St. Mary with its 12th-century Benedictine Monastery, and enjoy a refreshing swim in the heart of this beautiful park. (Entrance fees to Mljet National Park are included.) Return to the boat for lunch onboard.

In the evening, we set out for an excursion to the Pelješac Peninsula. Here we'll visit a family farm that produces four types of milk—sheep, goat, cow, and donkey—and is home to 15,000 grapevines and 70 olive trees.

Our visit includes a unique tasting of donkey milk and a traditional Dalmatian dinner:

- Aperitif: homemade brandy and sweet liqueurs
- Starter: smoked ham, pancetta, salami, cheese, ricotta, onions, and olives
- Main Course: lamb and beef baked under the bell with potatoes and vegetables
- Wines: unlimited red and white wines (Plavac Mali and Rukatac varieties)
- Homemade bread and salad

The evening continues with live music before returning to the ship. (B,L,Village Dinner)



Friday, October 16 - Slano to Dubrovnik

We set sail in the morning toward Dubrovnik, passing the picturesque Elaphiti Islands on our way directly to the historic center of this remarkable city, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Along the way, we'll enjoy a unique perspective as we cruise alongside Dubrovnik's impressive city walls and fortifications, followed by lunch onboard.

Upon arrival, we will transfer to Dubrovnik's Old Town via wooden boat. Here, our guide will lead us on a walking tour through the city's most iconic sights before giving you free time to explore on your own—walk the famous City Walls, wander charming streets, or take the cable car to the top of Mount Srđ for breathtaking views.

A return transfer to the ship by motorcoach is arranged for the evening, though you may also choose to return at your own pace.

Discover for yourself why Dubrovnik is celebrated worldwide as The Pearl of the Adriatic. (B,L)
