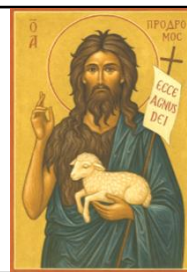

Sunday Reflection:

The parable speaks very directly to modern life because we are constantly being told what should be our "treasure." Today, many people invest most of their time and energy in: Career success, Financial security, Social status, Technology and entertainment, Personal achievement. None of these things are wrong in themselves, but Jesus asks whether they have become our ultimate treasure. The problem is that all these things can be lost or can leave us feeling unsatisfied. The hidden treasure reminds us that the deepest meaning of life is found not in what we own, but in our relationship with God. Jesus teaches that when we discover God's Kingdom, our priorities change. A busy professional who chooses to prioritise time for prayer and family. A young person who values faith and integrity. Someone who gives time to serve others, even when life is busy. In each case, a person is recognising that some things are more valuable than money, comfort or recognition. In a world filled with noise, the treasure may be hidden beneath distractions. We can become so occupied with daily concerns that we overlook the presence of God in ordinary moments—in the Mass, in prayer, in Scripture and in acts of love toward others. The challenge of the Gospel is not simply to find the treasure but to recognise its value. Many people spend their lives searching for happiness; Jesus tells us that true and lasting joy is found in Him. The man in the parable sells everything "out of joy" because he knows the treasure is worth far more than what he gives up. In today's world, we are encouraged to accumulate more, achieve more and possess more. Jesus offers a different vision. The greatest treasure is not something we own but Someone we know. When Christ becomes the centre of our lives, everything else finds its proper place, and we discover the joy and purpose for which we were created.
