Reflection for the 1st Sunday of Advent—Year A— St Matthew
Advent begins with a wake-up call: "Stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (Matthew 24:42). The Church invites us to start the new liturgical year not with noise or celebration, but with watchfulness, anticipation and hope.

Isaiah, in the first reading, gives us a vision of all nations streaming to the mountain of the Lord, where there is peace because they are in the presence of the Lord. St. Paul urges us to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" and live as people of the light. Advent is not just waiting—it is active discipleship, embodying Christ's presence here and now.

Jesus reminds us in the Gospel this weekend that His coming will be sudden so we must be ready. In this sense our whole lives are an Advent, a preparation to meet Him at the moment of our death, His return in glory and the general judgement. Each of us must be ready to 'give and account of our lives' as St Paul writes to the Romans. The loving warning is that we must be always ready for that moment, meeting and judgment. Do not put it off until tomorrow because there may not be a tomorrow!

Advent is not passive waiting. It is active preparation: prayer, awareness and Confession of sin, generosity and attentiveness to the things of God and those in need. Each candle we light on the Advent wreath is a sign that Christ's light is drawing nearer; a reminder that the light will always triumph over darkness and Christ is that triumphant light, without whom we remain in the dark. Let us begin this season by asking. Where am I spiritually asleep? How can I be prepared for the meeting with Christ?

The Bishop has asked that we pray this prayer at Mass from 1st Sunday of Advent through to the Solemnity of Pentecost (24th May 2026). Prayer cards are available at the back of the Church
