

REFLECTION:

Today's readings invite us to linger in the mystery of Christmas a little longer. While the world has already moved on, the Church draws us deeper. John's Gospel takes us behind the scenes of Bethlehem to the very heart of eternity: "In the beginning was the Word." The Child in the manger is the eternal Word through whom all things were made. The Wisdom praised in Sirach, who pitched her tent among God's people, now takes flesh and dwells among us. St Paul reminds us that Christ comes not only to reveal who God is, but who we are meant to be: "He destined us for adoption as His children."

Christmas is not simply a tender story; it is a revelation of our dignity.

If God has chosen to dwell among us, then no life is insignificant, no moment is without grace, no darkness is final.

At the beginning of a new year, with two more feasts of Christmas to celebrate (the Epiphany and Baptism of the Lord), the Gospel places a simple question before us: Will we make room for the Word?

The Word became flesh so that our own daily lives—ordinary, imperfect, often complicated and beautiful—might shine with God's presence.

May His light guide our steps in the days ahead.



Reflection for the Epiphany of the Lord.

The Epiphany celebrates the great manifestation of Christ to the nations. The Magi arrive from distant lands, guided only by a star and a restless longing in their hearts. They have no Scriptures, no prophets, no covenant. And yet they come. They come because God has already begun stirring in them a desire for truth, for goodness, for a light greater than any they have known.

Epiphany reminds us that God's grace is always reaching outward. Christ is not revealed only to the familiar, the prepared, or the religiously fluent.

He is revealed to seekers, wanderers, outsiders—anyone whose heart is open enough to notice the star God places before them.

The Magi teach us four movements of discipleship:

They look up. They pay attention to the signs of God's presence in the ordinary rhythms of life.

They set out. Faith is not an idea but a journey, often long and inconvenient.


They bow down. When they finally meet Christ, they offer not only gifts but themselves.

They return "by another way." An encounter with Christ always changes our direction. We cannot go back unchanged. Politics, certainly Party politics, manifesto, ideology, Corporations, focus groups, or technology can not save us, can not replace encounter with the living God. They may make us feel better about ourselves, important and influential, but it is the relationship with the God made flesh which changes us at the core of our nature and prepares us for eternity.

May we, like the Magi, have the courage to follow the light we are given, trusting that it will always lead us to the One who is Light itself.
