

Reflection for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Our patron, St John the Baptist gives us a simple but powerful message this Sunday: "Behold the Lamb of God." It is the prayer of every Mass before we receive Jesus in Holy Communion.

St John, cousin and friend of the Lord does not draw attention to himself, but rather he points directly to Jesus. In a world full of noise, opinions and self-promotion, John reminds us that faith begins with recognising Christ standing quietly in our midst.

Isaiah speaks of God's servant becoming "a light to the nations," and Paul reminds the Corinthians that they are "called to be holy." These aren't abstract ideas. They describe what happens when ordinary people allow their lives to point toward Christ—through patience, kindness, forgiveness, and the courage to choose what is good even when it is costly. St John did what was right even when it was difficult and unpopular, even when it would mean prison and death. He had seen, heard and known Jesus, the Lamb of God and that relationship drove him to proclaim the truth.

This week, the Gospel invites us to ask: Where is Jesus already present in my life, waiting to be noticed?

And just as importantly: Who might need me to be a gentle signpost toward hope or mercy?

May we, like our patron St John, have the humility to step aside and the clarity and the courage to point others toward the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Remember,

O most gracious Virgin Mary,

that never was it known
that anyone who fled to thy
protection, implored thy help
or sought thy intercession,
was left unaided.

Inspired with this confidence,
I fly to thee, O Virgin of virgins,
my Mother.

To thee I come; before thee
I stand, sinful and sorrowful.

O Mother of the Word Incarnate,
despite not my petitions,
but in thy mercy hear
and answer me. Amen.
