

Reflection for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."

This Sunday highlights a central truth of our faith: God's revelation is not abstract or distant. It breaks into human history and into our personal lives.

Isaiah's prophecy of light shining in darkness prepares us to recognize Jesus as the fulfilment of God's promise—a light that guides, heals, and restores.

In the Gospel, Jesus begins His ministry by calling ordinary fishermen.

This is not accidental. It teaches us something essential about discipleship:

- God calls real people in real circumstances, not the already-perfect.
- The call to follow Jesus always involves conversion, a turning away from darkness toward His light.
- Discipleship is active, not passive. The first disciples "left their nets," showing that following Christ reshapes priorities and daily life.

For us, the same pattern holds. Christ's light reaches into our routines, our struggles, our relationships. He invites us to respond—not necessarily by leaving our jobs or homes, but by allowing His Word to reorder our hearts and choices.

Remember,
O most gracious Virgin Mary,
that never was it known
that anyone who fled to thy
protection, implored thy help
or sought thy intercession,
was left unaided.
Inspired with this confidence,
I fly to thee, O Virgin of virgins,
my Mother.
To thee I come; before thee
I stand, sinful and sorrowful.
O Mother of the Word
Incarnate,
despise not my petitions,
but in thy mercy hear
and answer me. Amen.
