



The Great Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday 18th of February.

It is not a Holy Day of Obligation but it is a day of both Fasting and Abstinence from meat.
Those over eighteen are bound by the law of fasting until the beginning of their sixtieth year (59),
while all over fourteen are bound by the law of abstinence.

All the Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence (14+) from meat and where possible fasting from food or some
other act of penance is strongly recommended.

Ramadan also falls on Ash Wednesday, Muslims fast which means they change the time of eating to the hours of darkness, breaking the 'fast' at sunset. The Lenten fasts are a denial of food or other activity and the time or money is then given to those in need. This can be done via the box for the Bethlehem Hospice, SVP or other charity. Self-denial is a key element of the great season in preparation of the Easter mysteries, it are not easy but it focuses the heart and mind by mastery of the body. In a world obsessed with the purely earthly and physical it is a practical and spiritual exercise of reliance upon the grace of God. Confession, fasting, abstinence and alms giving have always been, and remain, a powerful help to the spiritual battle of Lent.

There will be a 12noon and 7pm Mass with Confessions before / after each Mass on Ash Wednesday

Reflection:

Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount by going straight to the heart. "You have heard... but I say to you." He isn't abolishing the law; He is revealing its deepest purpose. God's commandments were never meant to be a checklist but a path toward a transformed heart.

Sirach reminds us that God sets before us life and death, blessing and curse. Not as a threat, but as a profound affirmation of our dignity: we are free, capable of choosing the good, capable of becoming people whose actions flow from love rather than obligation.

Jesus invites us to look beneath the surface of our lives. Anger, resentment, grudges, quiet contempt—these may never make headlines, but they shape the world around us. The Kingdom grows when reconciliation becomes more important than being right, when fidelity is cherished, when our words carry truth and gentleness.

This Sunday asks us to consider: Where is Jesus inviting me to go deeper—not just avoiding what is wrong, but choosing what is life-giving? What relationship needs healing? What hidden attitude needs His grace? Holiness is not about perfectionism. It is about letting Christ reshape our hearts so that love becomes our instinct and thereby challenge the nonsense of a bankrupt culture.

Remember,
O most gracious Virgin Mary,
that never was it known
that anyone who fled to thy
protection, implored thy help
or sought thy intercession,
was left unaided.
Inspired with this confidence,
I fly to thee, O Virgin of virgins,
my Mother.
To thee I come; before thee
I stand, sinful and sorrowful.
O Mother of the Word
Incarnate,
despise not my petitions,
but in thy mercy hear
and answer me. Amen.
