



The 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, invites us to reflect on endurance, vigilance and hope amid trials and upheaval. The Prophet, Malachi (4:1–2) gives a prophetic warning of the coming day of the Lord—blazing like an oven for the arrogant, but healing for those who fear God.

St Paul, writing to the Thessalonians a second time (3:7-12) exhorts believers to live responsibly, work diligently and avoid idleness—"if they will not work, let them not eat".

In St Luke's (21:5–19) Jesus foretells the destruction of the Temple (70AD) and warns of wars, persecution, and betrayal but promises divine wisdom and endurance.

As the liturgical year draws to a close, the Church turns our gaze toward the "last things"—not to frighten us, but to awaken us. Jesus speaks apocalyptically, not to predict dates, but to prepare hearts. The Temple, once the centre of Jewish life, will fall. So too will empires, institutions, Parties, Governments and even personal certainties.

However, God alone remains.

Jesus says, "By your endurance you will gain your souls" (Lk 21:19). This is not passive waiting—it's active faithfulness. In a world of chaos, endurance means:

Holding fast to truth revealed by God, when deception abounds. Living with integrity when others grow cynical, or 'go along to get along'.

Trusting in God's justice when evil seems to prosper.

Malachi's image of the sun of righteousness rising with healing in its wings reminds us that judgment is not only fire it is also light. For those who fear the Lord, the end is not doom but dawn.

Paul's letter to the Thessalonians grounds this cosmic vision in daily life. Faith is not escapism—it is expressed in work, in

personal responsibility, duty, fidelity, in community. "Do not grow weary in doing good."

This Sunday's readings speak powerfully to our times. Wars, division, collapse, social and moral confusion can feel like signs of the end. But Jesus tells us: Do not be terrified. These are not the end—they are birth pangs. The Church, like a mother, teaches us to endure with hope, to work with love and to await the final Advent of Christ.

Let us ask for the grace of endurance—not grim survival, but joyful perseverance. May we be found faithful, not fearful. And may our lives, even in trial, reflect the light of the coming Kingdom.
