Pope Leo XIV has expressed his great sadness at Sunday's attack on Christian worshippers in the DRC by an affiliate of the so-called Islamic State. The victims were taking part in an all-night vigil in a church in Ituri province, when fighters attacked them with machetes. Nine of those killed were children.

"I renew my deep pain for the brutal terrorist attack that occurred on the night between 26 and 27 July in Komanda, in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo where more than 40 Christians were killed in a church during a prayer vigil and in their homes. While I entrust the victims to God's loving mercy, I pray for the wounded and for Christians who around the world continue to suffer violence and persecution, exhorting all those with responsibility at the local and international level to collaborate to prevent similar tragedies.

Pope Leo XIV has bestowed one of the Church's highest honours on the English saint, St. John Henry, Cardinal Newman, declaring him a "doctor" of the church. The rare designation was announced on Thursday from the Holy See. This decision holds personal resonance for our Holy Father, given St John Henry, Cardinal Newman's profound admiration for St. Augustine, the foundational inspiration for Pope Leo's own Augustinian religious order. The title of "Doctor of the Church" is reserved for individuals whose theological writings have profoundly served the universal church. In the 2,000-year history of the Church, only three dozen figures have been granted this honour, including revered saints such as St Augustine, St. Francis de Sales, St Thomas Aquinas and St. Teresa of Avila.



Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23: "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" The author laments the futility of human toil, especially when its fruits are passed on to someone who did not labour for them.

Luke 12:13-21: Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool who stores up wealth but dies before he can enjoy it. "This is how it will be for those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God." The author's cry—"vanity of vanities"—is not a rejection of work or wisdom, but a sobering reminder that **earthly achievements are not ultimate ends**. The rich man in Jesus' parable mirrors this: he builds bigger barns, plans a life of ease, and yet his soul is demanded of him that very night. Man proposes, God disposes. Both readings confront us with the **illusion of permanence**. We labour, we plan, we accumulate—but we cannot control time, not one penny will prolong our life but the stress in striving for it may shorten it. The tragedy is not in wealth itself, but in **placing our trust in it**. Jesus doesn't condemn productivity or planning. What He condemns is **greed and spiritual blindness**. The rich, in pursuit of more and even more, fail to considers other, never thank God, never asks what wealth is for. Life becomes closed circuit

of self-indulgence or at least self-centredness and others relegated to the periphery.

The author of Ecclesiastes' lament and Jesus' parable converge on one truth: life's meaning is not found in possessions, but in purpose and relationship. That purpose is found in being "rich toward God"—a phrase that invites us to invest in: Compassion and generosity, Faith and trust in God and Relationships that reflect divine love.

In our consumer-driven world, success is often measured by accumulation. But Scripture challenges us to ask:

What will endure? What legacy do we leave—not in wealth, but in witness? Do I define my worth by what I own or by who I am in Christ? Am I building barns or building bridges? Do I labour for things that perish, or for treasures that last? Let us not be fools who build without considering eternity. Let us be wise stewards who recognize that everything is gift, and that the greatest investment is in the Kingdom of God. As St. Paul reminds us in Colossians 3 (also part of the Sunday readings): "Seek what is above... not what is on earth." For in Christ, our life is hidden, secure, and eternal.
