In the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, this week, we are invited into the quiet rhythm of contemplation and the bold power of intercession. The Rosary is not merely a string of beads—it is a spiritual lifeline, a tapestry of the Gospel woven through the mysteries of Christ's life, death, and resurrection and the effects of his grace. At the Battle of Lepanto, when Christian forces were outnumbered by the colonising Ottoman forces, Pope St Pius V called upon the faithful to pray the Rosary. Victory came not by might, but by grace. This feast reminds us that in our own battles—whether personal, communal, or global—

Our Lady leads us to Christ, and Christ leads us to peace.

Each Hail Mary is a seed of hope. Each mystery is a doorway to deeper love. Let us not rush through the Rosary, but dwell in it. As St. John Paul II said, it is "a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness." Our Lady of Fatima, whose feast we celebrate next week, called for the Rosary to be prayed for conversion, for peace, for faith, for the church and for families. It can take time to adopt into our lives but the rewards are powerful. Never has the power of the Rosary, 'scripture on beads' and the intercession of His and our mother, been more needed in the world, our lives and families. So, let us take up our Rosaries not as relics, but instruments of mercy and peace, and chains of love that bind us ever closer to the heart of Jesus through the heart of Mary.
