October—Month of the Holy Rosary:

Throughout the month of October we will pray a decade of the Rosary for Peace at the end of Holy Mass There will also be Rosary and Reflection on Monday's in October at 7pm –8pm either in the Hall or Narthex.

Holy Souls:

Envelopes for the enrolment of our deceased loved ones on the 'November Dead List' are available in the Narthex. Please complete the form, place it with any donation in the envelope, and put it in the Box. November Dead list Masses are offered throughout the year and remembered in all the Masses of November. The casket with the list remains on the Sanctuary throughout November and thereafter in the Sacred Heart Chapel for the rest of the year.

On Sunday, our Holy Father will raise to the Altar, in the Mass of Canonisation, Bartolo Longo, whom St John Paul II called, '*The Apostle of Holy Rosary*'. His life was an extraordinary journey. St. Bartolo Longo reminds us that no one is beyond the reach of God's mercy. Born in 1841, Bartolo was raised Catholic but drifted far from the faith during his university years, even becoming a satanic 'priest', lost in drug use and deep depression. Yet, through intercession of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, the prayers of loved ones and the gentle witness of faithful friends, he experienced a profound conversion. He returned to the Church, became a Third Order Dominican (a lay person who lives the life and rule of the Dominican Order in their daily life), dedicated his life

to promoting the Rosary and serving the poor in Pompeii. What makes St Bartolo's story so powerful is not just his redemption, but his response to grace. He once said, "Charity without faith would be an absolute lie; faith without charity would be an absolute inconsistency" and he lived this truth by building the Shrine of Our Lady of Pompeii and founding charitable institutions for orphans, the children of prisoners, the marginalized and building clinics. His life echoes the parable of the prodigal son. St Bartolo did not just renounce satan and all his lies and come home; he built a home for others. He reminds us that our past does not define us—our response to God's love does. So let us ask: Where in our lives do we need to return to the Father? How might we, like St Bartolo, become instruments of mercy and healing for others?
