Suggestions for Catechesis and Prayer in the Home

Fathers:

- 1. Lead by example: be the first to pray, the first to fast, the first to repent, the first to instruct, the first to sacrifice
- 2. Bless (using your thumb make the sign of the cross on the forehead) your wife and children
- 3. Sprinkle Holy Water throughout your home while saying "Let God arise, and let his enemies be scattered: and let them that hate him flee from before his face. As smoke vanisheth, so let them vanish away: as wax melteth before the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God." (Psalm 67)
- 4. Always seek your wife's counsel and listen well
- 5. Read at least a portion of the Holy Gospels to the family daily
- 6. Pray the Psalms, at least a portion of the Holy Rosary, or a part of the Divine Office with the family at least once a day
- 7. Protect the home and the senses of the family from immoral and blasphemous images, songs, and entertainment
- 8. Learn about the saints, the feast days, the traditional fasting seasons, and the faith so you can pass it on

Mothers:

- 1. Encourage, support and remind your husband to do all of the above
- 2. Make the sign of the Cross with your thumb on the forehead of your children and pray for your husband
- 3. Share with the family the beauty of Christ's work and love in your own life
- 4. Teach the Commandments and the Beatitudes with your words and works
- 5. Encourage the children to pray about their vocation and be open to monastic life and priesthood. Those particular vocations should be treasured.
- 6. Read Scripture and the Lives of the Saints to your children
- 7. Your prayers, tears, and sacrifices can convert husbands and children

More Suggestions:

- 1. Have a priest formally bless your home and then feed him
- 2. Have times of silence (device and computer free) in the home
- 3. Consider making a pilgrimage instead of taking a vacation
- 4. Use vacation time for Holy Days of Obligation
- 5. Dedicate your home to a saint or Feast Day/you can even dedicate each room to a saint. If you can't decide, dedicate it to the Holy Mother of God.
- 6. Celebrate name days, baptism anniversaries, patronal feast days
- 7. Have family dinners
- 8. Post the 10 commandments in the House
- 9. Learn something about the saints being commemorated today
- 10. Make time to read the catechism and share what you learned (it can be very brief and inserted into conversation)
- 11. Friday Fasts for someone or something
- 12. Bring bulletins home and use them
- 13. Ask for forgiveness when you sin against each other. Repent in the home.
