### **Diane McGraw, Producer**

Diane McGraw, President of McGraw Productions, oversees the production, management and marketing of Legends for Peace. As the former Executive Director the Philadelphia Sports Congress she spearheaded Philadelphia's bid to host the 1994 FIFA World Cup and was the key producer of the 1989 Philadelphia Cup featuring the U.S. Men's National Team exhibition vs. DNEPR, Ukraine at Franklin Field attended by 43,000+ soccer fans and U.S. vs. Sheffield Wednesday at Veterans Stadium with 45,000 in attendance. Diane went on to become the CEO /President of the Orlando Commission where she served on the Host Committee of Orlando World Cup '94 and Chair of the Special Events Committee for the 1996 US Olympic Soccer Championships. In 1996, she became the CEO and President and launched the Los Angeles Sports and Entertainment Commission where she hosted the Concacaf Gold Cup at the LA Coliseum. Throughout her 30 year career, McGraw has bid for, hosted and produced hundreds of international and national sports and entertainment events in Philadelphia, Los Angeles, New York, Orlando, Louisville and the Netherlands.



### **Maurice Edu, Director of Player Development**

Maurice was a midfielder/ defender and former U.S. National Team player from 2007-2014. He was the first overall pick in the 2007 MLS Super Draft and one the MLS Rookie of the Year Award with Toronto. His performances earned him the attention of clubs in Europe where he signed with the Rangers, winning the Scottish Premiere League three times. He played for the Philadelphia Union from 2014-2017 and currently works for Fox Sports as a commentator for MLS Games. He recently covered the World Cup in Qatar for Fox Sports.
