Chore Services

Do you know that MCCoA has a Chore team that helps with minor household clean-ups and repairs to help keep you safe in your home. Some examples of work they do are: trimming shrubs, washing windows, shampooing carpets, installing grab bars, changing hard-to-reach light bulbs and more. This does not include housework, lawn mowing, major home or appliance repair or anything involving reaching a second story. If you have a need that is beyond our scope, we are willing to assess and help find the best way to resolve it. Chore also keeps the Senior Center a safe, neat place to be.

To schedule a chore, call the office at 419-586-1644. Many factors go into scheduling chores, such as weather, previous commitments and available funding. There is no fee for our services, but we do ask clients, who are able, to pay for necessary materials. To stay on schedule, additional projects cannot be added to existing appointments. New requests will be scheduled as quickly as possible in the order they are received. Thank you for understanding.

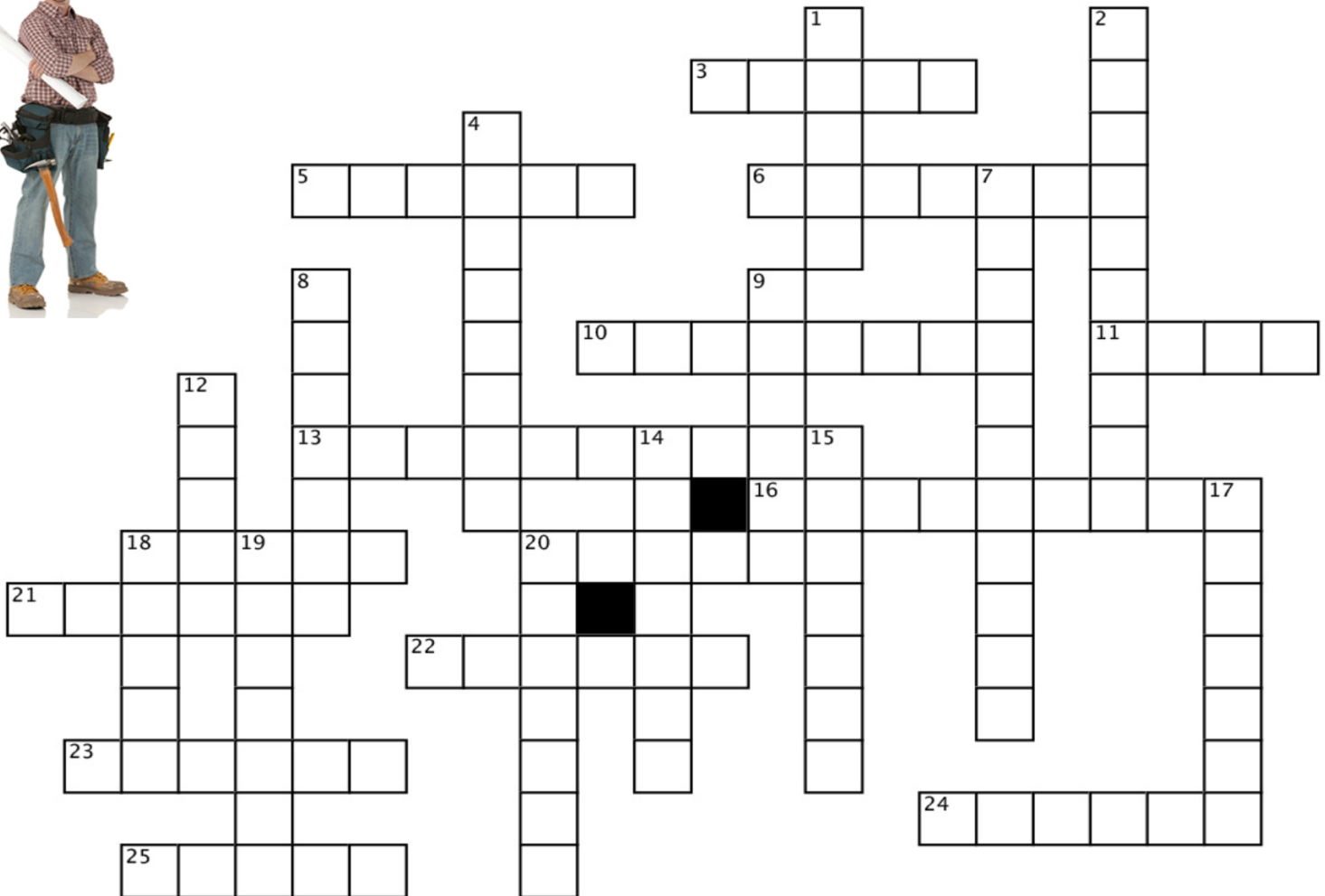

Medicare Open Enrollment is Almost Here!

October 15 - December 7, 2026

Medicare Open Enrollment runs October 15 through December 7, 2026. During this time, Medicare beneficiaries can review and make changes to their Prescription Drug Plans (Part D) and Medicare Advantage Plans for coverage effective January 1, 2027.

MCCoA Outreach will once again offer Open Enrollment appointments to provide unbiased plan comparisons and help you evaluate your coverage options. To help us prepare for your appointment, please submit your completed Medicare Open Enrollment Worksheet and required documents (see the list on the right) to our office before scheduling. This allows us to complete your plan comparison in advance so you can make the most of your appointment.

New to Medicare?

Contact us before October so we can schedule an appointment to help you set up your Medicare.gov account.

To do this, we will need:

- A valid email address
- Access to email during setup (smart phone)
- Valid ID with current address

We will answer any questions and review upcoming changes to your coverage.

Required documents:

- Your Medicare card
- A list of your current doctors and specialists
- A printed, current list of medications (including dosage and frequency)
- Your preferred pharmacy
- Any insurance cards related to your current coverage

MCCoA Medicare Open Enrollment Worksheet - 2027

The Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program (OSHIIIP) from the Ohio Department of Insurance recommends that you review your Medicare options EVERY year. All Medicare beneficiaries can add, drop, or change their health and drug coverage during the Annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period.

The Annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP) is from October 15th - December 7th.
Any changes made during the OEP take effect January 1st of the following year.

A Medicare plan review can help ensure you're getting the best coverage while keeping your 2027 premiums and prescription costs affordable.

If you currently get your prescription drug coverage through TRICARE, VA benefits, Federal Employee Retirement Benefits, or any employer/union health plan, it is usually best to keep that credible coverage without any changes. You should contact your benefits administrator for information about your current benefits before making any decisions.
