## Stewardship 2026

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that starts at the beginning of time and reveals the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the Old Testament and prophetic tradition until our story recounts the life and witness of Jesus Christ the Son of God. But that story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we are transformed by the work of the Holy Spirit and the Good News of Jesus Christ.

All year we have been dwelling in Luke's Gospel which is bookended by the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilance to the Disciples.

So, what is your Good News; the idea, dream or challenge placed in your heart by God that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your family, your church and your community.

This fall at St George's, we will be focusing some time on these stories – the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing narrative – the ongoing Creation. We will hear some stories from our church family and maybe even spend some time writing our own. And we will consider the ways our own experience of creativity and service has deepened our faith. So maybe in a quiet moment, give some time over the next few weeks to think about how your own soul cries out to spread the Good News in thought, word and deed.

Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!

### N-Word Duet - Sun Oct 26

Join us at 11:30 on Sunday Oct 26 to hear a presentation about how privilege and prejudice affect our lives and relationships and the possibility of growth and change.

Alexander Payne Morgan and Dwight Stackhouse will be reading from their play "The N-Word Duet: A Shared Recollection of Racism and Recovery" the play traces the theme "from innocence to understanding" from two opposite



sides. Alex's journey is from blind loyalty to his family's white supremacy (his "innocence") to the truth about his racism. Dwight's journey is from the beautiful innocence of his sheltered upbringing in a non-racist integrated neighborhood in Detroit to the truth that people can hate him for the color of his skin and social institutions can act accordingly.
